Green News You Can Use

As we continue looking at how government can become more efficient and responsive, the Board and I approved two new initiatives and will soon embark on a third.

- 1. A free service will come to River Forest that can help curb flooding and conserve water. Rain barrels will be distributed through the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. Roll out is expected in the spring. This new program comes as a result of our partnership with the River Forest Parks Foundation Sustainability Committee. We thank those volunteers for continuing to educate us on how we can be better stewards of our environment. To read more about the program, click <u>here</u>. - 2. The Village, Park District and District 90 have agreed to work collaboratively to clear snow and salt sidewalks and parking lots around schools, parks and the public library. Working in partnership with other taxing bodies will save time and money and improve the quality of life for all the residents of River Forest.
- **3.** Village-wide collaboration efforts are taking shape. A first-ever subcommittee, comprised of an elected official from each taxing district serving River Forest, will soon start exploring how we can come together to solve pressing community issues. There are many things we can do to help River Forest progress, and I am confident that this experienced and knowledgeable group of

residents can work together for the common good. The Board of Trustees and I and the boards of all units of government anticipate good things coming from this group.

A few quick updates:

- The Northside Stormwater Management Project is progressing nicely down Greenfield and the side streets between Division and Greenfield. We anticipate that asphalt will be laid and most of the restoration work will be complete by the end of November.
- **2.** The Madison streetscape is on schedule and, by the end of next spring; we will see new planters, benches and lighting.
- **3.** Many of you have asked about the growing skunk and deer populations this year. There are few real options the Village has to control wildlife; however, the Village published tips on its website that residents can use to make their properties less desirable to wildlife. Trick or Treating Hours and Tips for a Safe Halloween

In order to have a safe and fun Halloween, the Village of River Forest has set official trick-or-treating hours from 12 noon to 5 PM on Saturday, October 31. Residents are asked to try their best to participate within these hours.

Additional Trick-or-Treating Safety Tips from the Village of River Forest:

- Make sure your costume is visible to vehicles and others.
- Instead of a candle to light a pumpkin, use a small flashlight or a liquid light stick that glows in the dark.
- Purchase only flame retardant or flame proof costumes and masks.
- Be sure costumes fit properly to prevent tripping or falling and wear masks that allow full vision.
- Do not trick or treat alone.
- Only approach homes that are well lit and only approach the front door.
- Stay on sidewalks and obey traffic signs/signals.
- Carry a flashlight.
- Adults should check their child's candy before they eat it.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Village's annual Fall Leaf Collection Program runs through November 27th. The next opportunity to dispose of leaves after November 27th will be during the yard waste collection program which starts in April 2016. Rake only leaves onto the street by 7 a.m. on your collection day, leaving the curb exposed, where Village and Strom crews will collect them. Grass clippings, brush or any other type of yard waste mixed with your leaves will not be collected. Leaves are collected on both sides of the street in accordance with the following schedule:

Mondays: The area west of Thatcher including Edgewood, Auvergne, River Oaks and Lake, and all streets south of the Union Pacific Rail Road tracks.

Tuesdays: Harlem through and including William.

Wednesdays: Monroe through and including Lathrop, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Thursdays: Ashland through and including Park, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Fridays: Forest through and including Thatcher, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Know the Code!

Here are a few friendly reminders:

- Lawn yard waste bags cannot go on parkway before 6 p.m. on Monday.
- Large items such as furniture, televisions, etc. cannot be left out on the parkway to see if someone will take them. Large items put out for pickup must have a garbage tag and cannot be put out until the night before the assigned pick up day.
- If for some reason your refuse is not picked-up on your regularly scheduled day, please call Strom at (708)344-5000 to reschedule a date. You cannot leave your refuse out until the next scheduled date.

- Tree Identification Workshop. Sunday, October 11, 1 p.m., at Trailside Museum, 738 Thatcher Ave., in River Forest. Learn to identify local trees by bud and leaf shape, habitat and bark. Register at least two days in advance by calling 708-366-6530.
- Lemon-Aid Stand Successfully Goes Zero-Waste. Congratulations to the *LemonAid Stand* for their Zero-waste efforts! Over 2,500 people attended this year and the event created only 21 pounds of waste. Not only is the *LemonAid Stand* supporting local charities and creating a healthy community, they are also great examples of taking care of the planet. The event generated 340 pounds of waste but through the use of waste stations the *LemonAid Stand* was able to divert 94% of that waste, or 319 pounds, from the landfill.
- Rain Barrels in the Spring. New for next spring, Free Rain Barrels. It is a bit early to be thinking spring but the Sustainability Committee is excited to share the news of the recently approved program. Next spring River Forest will partner with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Chicago to offer free rain barrels to any resident who disconnects downspouts from the sewer system. Up to four rain barrels and hardware are available per household.
