Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to May.

I am pleased to report that the River Forest Board of Trustees adopted the Village budget for the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year. Because of excellent management, prudent planning and careful monitoring of our bottom line, our budget again will be balanced. <u>Click</u> <u>here</u> to view the budget.

The Village remains financially stable and the budget includes modest revenue growth due to higher retail sales, permit fees and use fees. In addition, our use tax increased due to a tax imposed by the State on purchases made out of state but used in Illinois on Amazon.com.

Fiscal health is particularly important for the General Fund, which is the Village's major operating fund. Approximately 50 percent of the Village's total projected expenses are in the General Fund. This

fund includes the salaries and benefits of Village employees, from the Police officer who responds to a traffic accident, to the firefighter/paramedic who comes to the aid of our residents, and the staff who respond to your questions when you come to Village Hall. It also includes the Village's contribution to the West Suburban Consolidated Dispatch Center, which represents a joint effort between River Forest, Elmwood Park, Oak Park and Park Ridge to offer this critical service in the most cost effective manner possible.

On the expense side, employer contributions for our Fire and Police Pension Fund obligations have risen significantly in order to meet the minimum required employer contribution required by state statute.

Sound business practices have allowed the Village to carry out the key goals that the Board of Trustees and I established late last vear. Among those goals is the creation of an updated update Comprehensive Plan that will the long-term recommendations for the maintenance and enhancement of the community as well as the improvements, developments and redevelopments desired. The current plan was first created in 2003 and updated in 2010 with the Corridor Study. The Village will keep you apprised of this vital undertaking as all of you will have an opportunity to take part in its development.

The Board also set a goal to enhance and elevate the Village's existing communications efforts. Enhancements will include, for example, a more user-friendly website. The Village will also upgrade other areas of its information technology systems that are vital to the delivery of Village services.

The Board of Trustees and I extend our deepest debt of gratitude to our outstanding professional team for keeping us fiscally sound and secure: Village Administrator Eric Palm, Finance Director Joan Rock and Assistant Village Administrator Lisa Scheiner. Thanks also go to Trustee Carmela Corsini, Finance Chair, and the finance committee for helping make this a smooth process. Congratulations for a job well done.

Our entire budget continues to align with the four overall objectives the Board considers vital to our quality of life here in River Forest: Provide a safe community for residents, ensure a financially stable and effective government, increase property values for taxpayers and stabilize property taxes.

The Village will continue retrofitting its street lights with LEDs. It's a great investment for brighter and even safer streets and in a more cost effective way. Last year the Village upgraded the side streets and will continue on to Division Street, Chicago Avenue and Washington Boulevard from Thatcher east to Harlem Avenue this year. lower upfront cost and use less electricity.

The Village is making progress on the proposed Tax Increment Finance (TIF) District on Madison Street. A community meeting to address residents' and business owners' concerns yielded valuable information. An audio recording of that meetina is available here and three important reports required for creation of the TIF are available by clicking here. A webpage devoted to TIF will be online soon. Our next required meeting will be held on June 3 at 2 p.m. at the River Forest Village Hall (400 Park Avenue) with the Joint Review Board, representatives from each taxing district affected by the TIF. A public hearing on the proposed Madison Street TIF District will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, July 12. The Board of Trustees could adopt ordinances establishing the TIF at its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, July 25.

The Lake and Lathrop redevelopment agreement was signed in March. One of the major reasons the Village Board and I pursued this project was to clean up the soil contamination underneath the buildings and in the parkway. We want to assure you that removal will be done effectively and safely.

I would like to inform you that the Village has taken Fresh Thyme and MidAmerica Real Estate to court in hopes of compelling them to make permanent repairs to the structure of the former Dominick's store on North Avenue. Work has been on hold there since mid-February when part of a facade on the northeast wall gave way. Since that time, the Village has made numerous requests to get a structural engineers' report that details the condition of the building, which was finally received last week. The needed repairs have been identified and Village staff are working with all parties necessary to ensure the work begins in an expedited manner. The decision to use the courts to move this process along was difficult step to take, but one we believe is prudent to protect the interests of our residents. We hope to resolve this issue soon so the company and the landlord of the property can open it as a Fresh Thyme Farmers Market.

The Village Board and I had the privilege of honoring talented young residents and students at our April 11 Board Meeting. We presented Excellent Achievement Awards to the River Forest finalists in the fifth annual One Earth Film Festival. Please join me in congratulating Willard School students Miles Toppen and Carter Workman, who were winners in the elementary school category for their film "Pretty Nice Island The Movie," as well as Trinity students Kate Conneely, Emma Alm, Veronka Lubeck, Sarah Whiteside and Katherine Cusack for their film "Green Team." The Village Board was also proud to present Addison Osta Smith with a proclamation recognizing her as the youngest and first female winner of the cooking competition, Master Chef Junior.





We hope you will take a bit of time from May 12 to May 19 to participate in the annual <u>Celebrating Seniors</u> events, which honor the many seniors who live in our community. They bring vitality and strength to River Forest, and we thank them for being here.

Passage of Fiscal Year 2017 Budget

The Budget is adopted by the Village Board and is the official financial plan for the Village's operating departments. In addition to financial information, the budget contains the Village Board goals, financial policies, and the five-year Capital Improvement Program. The Village's fiscal year begins on May 1st and ends April 30.

At the Monday, April 25th Village Board Meeting, the Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Fiscal Year 2017 Annual Operating and Capital Budget.

Pharmaceutical Drop-box Now Available

A Pharmaceutical drop-box is now available at Village Hall. The program allows residents to properly and safely dispose of unused, unwanted and expired prescription and over-the-counter medications in a secured collection box that is located in the basement of the Village Hall, just outside the elevator doors. Residents can drop off these items during the Village's normal business hours (Monday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., Tuesday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.).

Residents may bring medications in a sealed container or bag. If there is any personal information on a label the resident should remove or conceal the information before bringing it in. Unacceptable items include loose medications, liquid medicines (such as cough syrup), hypodermics, sharps, biomedical waste (including wound dressings), radioactive medicines and other household hazardous waste. Once an item is placed inside the box it cannot be removed and Village staff cannot open the box. All medications collected are disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner and cannot be reused. On a periodic basis the box will be emptied by Cook County Sheriff's Office personnel, and the medications will be destroyed off-site.

It was once thought that flushing medications down the toilet was an acceptable practice, however, municipal water and sewer systems are not equipped to filter out some of those waste products. This program alleviates pharmaceutical waste from entering our landfills, water and waste-water systems.

Free Rain Barrel Program

The Village of River Forest has partnered with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Chicago to offer free rain barrels to any resident who disconnects downspouts from the sewer system. Up to four rain barrels and hardware will be available per household. <u>Click here</u> for more info.

Landscape Contractor Hours

As a reminder, please remember that landscape contractors are required to be licensed with the Village and abide by the work hour restrictions. Landscape contractors are permitted to work Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. – 6 p.m., and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. They are not allowed to work on Sundays or holidays. Work conducted outside these hours could result in fines.

Lawn and Garden Sprinkling

As a reminder, lawn sprinkling utilizing Lake Michigan water through the municipal water system is prohibited from May 15

through September 15 of each year between the hours of ten o'clock A.M. and four o'clock P.M., Monday through Friday. If there is a danger of water shortage, the Village may restrict water usage further. <u>Click here</u> for some water saving tips.

Historic Preservation Award

The Historic Preservation Commission is currently accepting applications for 2016 Historic Preservation Awards from homeowners, architects or contractors who have completed qualifying jobs in River Forest since January 1, 2011.

The River Forest Historic Preservation Commission supports and encourages homeowners, builders and other professionals who help preserve the historic character of our Village. An awards program was established by the Commission in 2009 in order to support these efforts.

Nominations must be received on or before May 27, 2016. The awards will be announced at the Commission's regularly scheduled June 23, 2016 meeting. Multiple awards may be given each year. The nominated structure need not be in a historic district and may be a residential (single family or multiple unit), commercial, public/institutional or religious structure.

Know the Code!

The Village would like to remind all residents to be mindful with disposing of yard waste. In regards to code 6-3-6, the collection requirements for yard waste include the following:

 "Yard waste" is trees or tree branches (not exceeding four inches in diameter), brush, plant stalks and shrubs cut up and bound into bundles of no more than four feet in length and fifty pounds in weight, which bundles shall be bound with biodegradable twine and shall have one universal solid waste tag affixed to each bundle. Yard waste is also grass clippings, leaves, twigs, weeds and all other materials of similar nature placed in biodegradable paper bags (up to thirty two gallons in capacity) as described in section 6-3-1 of this chapter affixed with one universal solid waste tag. It shall be unlawful for any person to mix yard waste with other garbage and refuse.

 For non-alley collections, properly packaged yard waste will be picked up "curbside", as defined in section 6-3-1 of this chapter. Materials placed for such collection shall not be put out prior to six o'clock P.M. on Monday (the day before yard waste collection) and will be picked up on Tuesday. For alley collection, properly packaged yard waste shall be placed for collection next to the regular garbage collection point. It shall be unlawful to place yard waste within the street, alley or walkway.
