## Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to July. Many of us will take some long-awaited time off traveling with our families and friends or just relaxing. Please enjoy your summer vacations, safely!

I would like to update you on the status of the proposed Madison Street TIF (Tax Increment Finance) district. After the Village Board's very first meeting hearing residents' concerns, the Board of Trustees has decided to step back and look at restricting the use of eminent domain against homes adjacent to Madison Street. The revisions that the Board is considering signify that residents' comments have been taken seriously and will be addressed to the best of the Board's ability. Additional meetings with area residents and businesses will be conducted to consider revisions to the ordinance, the Joint Review Board will be reconvened and a public hearing will also be scheduled. Board would take final action on the ordinance creating the TIF in August, however, that will be rescheduled. In the meantime, the Village will continue to notify residents about the progress made on this item through mailings and by posting relevant and important information about the TIF on our Village website. The Village Board of Trustees and I encourage you to contact us should you have any questions or concerns.

River Forest created the Lake Street TIF in 1987 to improve the Village's fiscal health and enhance property values. The result of that was the Town Center I and II, which have become the Village's biggest economic engines. They produce the sales and property tax dollars needed to operate necessary services such as police, fire, public works and administration. They also provide needed tax revenue to River Forest school districts, the Park District, Library and Township. TIF is the most prudent redevelopment tool the Village has at its disposal to stabilize property taxes over the long term and advance the progress needed to remain a vibrant community.

This year marks the centenary of the only known development of Prairie-Style homes in the United States and, as it is here in River Forest, the Village has taken steps to acknowledge this milestone. The Board of Trustees adopted a **Resolution** that commemorates the anniversary of the 700 block of William Street and will soon install two honorary street signs at the intersection of the 700 block of William Street and Oak Avenue to mark the occasion. This neighborhood was built between 1913 and 1916, and residents continue to preserve its unique character. These efforts and others show the pride and dedication this community shares in protecting the historically significant structures in our community.

Seniors: RF Township and RF Fire Department Introduce the ICE Packet





The Board of Trustees and I approved a joint federal grant application with Elmwood Park for funding that would be used for North Avenue streetscape improvements from Lathrop Avenue east to Harlem Avenue. If the grant is awarded, River Forest and Elmwood Park envision that the North Avenue improvements will include new street lights, sidewalks, crosswalks, decorative pavement and landscaping, and that they will mirror the Madison Street improvements that were completed last year in cooperation with Forest Park. The estimated cost of the project is \$3.2 million, of which \$2 million would be funded through the grant. River Forest and Elmwood Park anticipate that each community will pay half of the remaining cost, or \$600,000 each. The Village's share will come from available funds in the capital improvement budget. The Village hopes to learn if the grant was awarded sometime this

I would also like to share with you that the Village is still working diligently with MidAmerica Real Estate Group to get repairs completed on the former Dominick's Finer Foods building. The Village Board and I want to assure residents that we are doing all we can to ensure the repairs are completed as quickly as possible. The Village looks forward to the opening of Fresh Thyme at this location.

The Village's Traffic and Safety Committee recently met and reviewed the on-street parking plan implemented last year near Roosevelt School. The Committee's recommendations will be considered at the July 12 Village Board Meeting and include the following proposed changes:

- Change Library parking on the east side of Lathrop Avenue to 60 minute parking;
- Extend the drop-off/pick-up zone on Jackson Street north to the fire hydrant;
- Change "Do not enter" restrictions on Jackson to 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.;
- Install more robust traffic cones or barricades on Oak Street at Jackson during the 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. closure;
- Examine a more permanent crosswalk solution for the west side of the Chicago Avenue/Jackson Street intersection.

Roadwork on Division Street between Thatcher Avenue and Harlem Avenue is set to begin next week. The project will include street resurfacing, improvements to the sidewalk crossings, and the addition of handicap ramps at intersections. This work will improve the quality of the street and sidewalk, allowing for improved traffic and safety conditions for motorist, pedestrians, and cyclists.

Division Street will be accessible throughout the project. Traffic will be maintained in both directions and driveways will remain accessible. On-street parking will be limited at times due to construction work areas and equipment. All work is scheduled to be completed by this fall.

### Laurel McMahon Retires from Village Historic Preservation Commission

The River Forest Historic Preservation Commission would like to recognize the contributions of Laurel McMahon to the quality of life in our Village upon her retirement from the commission. A longtime leading voice for history and preservation, Laurel was the primary advocate for the adoption of the initial preservation ordinance. She served as the commission's first chair, in addition to her active participation in the Historical Society of Oak Park and River Forest, as well as the River Forest Service Club. Laurel and her husband Dennis faithfully restored the 1882 William H. Hatch House at 306 Keystone Avenue, as evidenced by its inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. The commission has unanimously voted to name its annual Restoration Award in her honor.

#### 2016-2017 Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers are now available for purchase and must be affixed to your windshield by July 14 to avoid late fees and citations.

All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be downloaded <u>here</u>).
- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.
- Online at the Village Website by clicking <a href="here">here</a>.

Stickers cost \$45 for passenger vehicles, \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens. For additional information please contact Village Hall at 708-366-8500 or click **here**.

# Summer Safety from the River Forest Police Department

Warm weather is here, which means increased pedestrian and bicycle traffic on our streets and sidewalks. Please keep these tips in mind for everyone's safety:

- It's always best to walk on sidewalks or paths and cross at street corners using crosswalks.

- If you must walk or jog on a roadway, keep to the LEFT (against traffic) and be alert to vehicle traffic.
- When cycling in the roadway, ride to the RIGHT (with traffic).
- Cyclists in the roadway must obey the same "rules of the road" as motor vehicles, such as signaling turns, obeying traffic control devices, and right of way.
- Avoid wearing dark clothing when cycling, skating or jogging at night. Wear bright clothing, with reflective elements if possible.
- When cycling at night, state law requires bikes have a front light (white, visible at 500 feet) and a red reflector in the rear. RFPD recommends also using a red light attached to the rear.
- When cycling, always wear a helmet!
- Please notify RFPD of any suspicious behavior or circumstances you may see. If you are being followed or harassed, move to a safe location and call 911.

Additional Reminder: Curfew for juveniles under age 18 in River Forest is 11 PM - 6 AM on weeknights (Sun.-Thurs.); and 12 AM - 6 AM on weekends (Fri.-Sat.). Driving privileges (whether by learner's permit or Graduated Driver's License) for juveniles become invalid one hour prior to curfew (10 PM - 6 AM on weeknights and 11 PM - 6 AM on weekends.)

#### Know the Code!

The Village would like to remind all residents to be mindful of the following Village Code items during the summer season!

 Village Code Section 5-8-4 - Any tree/shrub which overhangs any sidewalk, street or other public place in the village in such a way as to impede/interfere with traffic or

- travel on such public place shall be trimmed by the owner. Any tree or limb of a tree which has become likely to fall on or across any public street, sidewalk or place shall be removed by the owner.
- 4-5-4 H. Signs In Rights Of Way: Except as provided in this subsection, no sign except governmental signs authorized in this chapter shall be placed in or extend into or over any public property or right of way. Temporary signs advertising civic functions may extend into or over a public right of way upon the specific prior approval of the village manager on the basis of need and impact on pedestrian and vehicular traffic, and impact on surrounding properties.
- Other specifics on sign allowance can be found in the Village Code Section 4-5-6.
