Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

I am pleased to announce that the Village is launching its very own River Forest [Facebook page](#). It will be used to share news and information with residents on upcoming events, seasonal community reminders, public safety alerts, updates from the Village board and commissions, and much more. The Village Board will be approving the 2017-2018 budget on April 24. A public hearing will be held at 7 p.m. at the Village Hall and Trustees will adopt the budget that evening.

The Village will again have a balanced budget, with less than a 1-percent increase to our levy (property tax). The Village Board will ensure that River Forest is a safe community for its residents, business owners and institutional partners, and we will work to protect and strengthen property values and implement strategies to stabilize property taxes.

I would like to highlight the long-term strategic goals that the Village Trustees and I recently established and that will be covered by the Village's annual spending plan:

Investing in Public Safety

- Support training and professional development opportunities for public safety employees.
- Invest in the continued use of technology advancements including an upgrade and expansion of our camera systems.
- Develop strategies for relocation of our 911 emergency communications center.
- Satisfy the Village's pension obligations per the

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Pension Funding Policy that was adopted by the Village Board.

Stabilizing Property taxes through Economic Development

- Complete property acquisition for Lake and Lathrop and ensure that the site is clear of contamination.
- Select a new preferred developer for the Lake and Park redevelopment project.
- Create the North Avenue Tax Increment Financing District
- Create a strategy for appropriate development in the Madison Street Tax Increment Financing District
- Ensure that Fresh Thyme Farmer's Market opens this summer.

Improving Property Values by Making River Forest a Better Place to Live

- Launch the new website that will be easier to navigate, integrate more pictures and videos and collaborate with other units of government to establish a community-wide calendar.
- Promote the use of our new mobile "app."
- Finalize a new resident brochure that will be available online and at the Village Hall. This brochure will provide valuable information about River Forest and the many wonderful attributes about our community.
- Begin work on an updated comprehensive plan for the Village. The last time the village updated our plan was 2003. To view the current plan [click here](#).
- Examine the Village's holiday decorations and other beautification standards and recommend changes where necessary.
- Work with the new Sustainability Commission to create a set of goals and objectives for the upcoming year.

Historic Preservation Award

The Historic Preservation Commission is currently accepting applications for 2017 Historic Preservation Awards from homeowners, architects or contractors who have completed qualifying jobs in River Forest since January 1, 2012.

The River Forest Historic Preservation Commission supports and encourages homeowners, builders and other professionals who help preserve the historic character of our Village. An awards program was established by the Commission in 2009 in order to support these efforts.

Nominations must be received on or before May 26, 2017. The awards will be announced at the Commission's regularly scheduled June 22, 2017 meeting. Multiple awards may be given each year. The nominated structure need not be in a historic district and may be a residential (single family or multiple unit), commercial, public/institutional or religious structure.

FEMA - Four Steps for Tornado Preparedness

Tornadoes develop so rapidly that little, if any, advance warning is possible. Every state has some risk of this hazard.

Tornadoes are nature's most violent storms. Spawned from

powerful thunderstorms, tornadoes can cause fatalities and devastate a neighborhood in seconds. A tornado appears as a rotating, funnel-shaped cloud that extends from a thunderstorm to the ground with whirling winds that can reach 300 miles per hour. Damage paths can be in excess of one mile wide and 50 miles long.

Distracted Driving Awareness Week

April 24-28 is Distracted Driving Awareness Week. In 2009, over 5,000 people lost their lives and over 400,000 people were injured in vehicle accidents in the U.S. related to distracted driving. Since that time, laws have been enacted to combat distracted driving.

In Illinois, all cell phone use (including phone calls, texting, GPS) must be hands free. Here are some tips from AAA to help you avoid distracted driving and avoid becoming a statistic:

1. **Turn it off.** Turn your phone off or switch it to silent mode before you get in the car. If you need to make a call, pull over to a safe area first.
2. **Spread the word.** Set up a special message to tell callers that you are driving and you'll get back to them as soon as possible, or sign up for a service that does this for you.
3. **Groom at home.** Shaving and applying makeup are best done prior to getting in the car.
4. **Use your passengers.** Ask a passenger to make the call for you.
5. **Stay safer, text later.** Don't text and drive, surf the web, or read your email while driving. It is dangerous and against the law in most states.
6. **Familiarize.** If you're traveling, know the state and local laws before you get in the car. Some states and localities prohibit the use of hand-held cell phones. For a listing of state laws, visit [TeenDriving.AAA.com](#). If you're traveling in a rental car, familiarize yourself with the vehicle's features before getting behind the wheel.
7. **Plan ahead.** Program GPS systems and review maps and directions before you start driving. If you need help while driving, ask a passenger or pull over to a safe location.
8. **Secure your pets.** Pets can be a big distraction in the car. Always secure your pets properly before you start to drive.
9. **Keep the kids safe.** Pull over to a safe location to address situations with your children in the car.
10. **Focus on the task at hand.** Refrain from smoking, eating, drinking, reading and any other activity that

takes your hands, mind, or eyes off the road.

Know the Code!

The Village would like to remind you:

- As the warmer months approach, please remember that all dogs must be leashed when on any public street, sidewalk, parkway, public area or unenclosed premises within the Village. Please see Section 8-3 of the [Village code](#) for all dog control information.
- Please note: The first date for yard waste collection was Tuesday April 4th, 2017.
 - "Yard waste" includes trees or tree branches (not exceeding four inches in diameter), brush, plant stalks and shrubs cut up and bound into bundles of no more than four feet in length and fifty pounds in weight. Bundles shall be bound with biodegradable twine and shall have one universal solid waste tag affixed to each bundle. Yard waste is also grass clippings, leaves, twigs, weeds and all other materials of similar nature placed in biodegradable paper bags (up to thirty-two gallons in capacity) and affixed with one universal solid waste tag. It is unlawful for any person to mix yard waste with other garbage and refuse.
 - For non-alley collections, properly packaged yard waste will be picked up "curbside". Materials placed for such collection may not be put out prior to 6:00 PM on Monday (the day before yard waste collection) and will be picked up on Tuesday. For alley collection, properly packaged yard waste may be placed for collection next to the regular garbage collection point. It is unlawful to place yard waste within the street, alley or walkway.

Wondering what to do with all those yard signs?

The following are great, green options for getting rid of your old yard signs:

- Drop your sign at the Des Plaines River Clean Up on April 22 and the Sustainability Commission will share them with groups that can re-use the signs.
- Ask the representative who gave you the sign if they would like it back for reuse.
- Save them for kids' school projects and/or signage for your own projects.
- Remove the metal stakes and place in a recycling bin and throw the sign in landfill container. (Although the sign is plastic, it is not recyclable).

April 22 - Free Finished Compost for Compost Subscribers

Subscribers to the Village's Curbside Compost Program can pick up free compost for their gardens on Saturday, April 22 starting at 8 AM at the Depot, 401 Thatcher. The container will remain in the parking lot for the entire day. Residents are asked to bring their own buckets and shovels for transporting compost. New Restaurant Added to Senior “Dine-Out Program”

Oak Park and River Forest Township Senior Services announces the addition of a new restaurant in the “Dine-Out Program” for seniors. Geppetto's in Oak Park is the 4th local eating establishment in the program, which gives seniors the opportunity to enjoy an affordable, well-balanced meal at specified local restaurants.

Seniors can purchase Dine-Out Program coupons at Township Senior Services (130 S. Oak Park Ave, Oak Park); coupons are \$4/meal. Seniors then use the coupons to purchase a meal at participating restaurants. Meals are selected from a pre-approved healthy menu and include an entrée, sides if appropriate and coffee, tea or milk.

Seniors must register for the program at Township Senior Services in Oak Park and obtain a program ID. Participants can purchase coupons there, or after registering, they can purchase coupons by mail. Coupons are available on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 AM -noon.

The four local participating restaurants are: Geppetto's, Robinson's Ribs, Cozy Corner and Grape Leaves, all in Oak Park.

Only coupons can be used to pay for Dine-Out Program meals, but we ask participants to consider tipping the wait staff. Questions: please call Township Senior Services at 708-383-8060.
