School will be in session later this month, which means that motorists should drive safely and be alert for additional pedestrians and bicyclists in the area. A study to identify the safest walking routes to school is wrapping up, and Village Staff are reviewing a draft map and report in early August. The map will be available to the community before the beginning of the school year, and the Village will work to implement study recommendations.

Preliminary work has begun on resurfacing Chicago Avenue. Before the Village's contractor can mobilize and begin excavating for the traffic bump-outs and rain gardens, there are a couple of private utility lines that need to be relocated. Nicor and AT&T will be at various locations along the Chicago Avenue corridor over the next 7-10 days. Once completed, the Village's contractor will begin working.

Here is what happened at the Village Board table in July:

River Forest Trustees have declared each and every July 9 as "McKenzie and Charlotte Reusable Bag Day." McKenzie Lovell and Charlotte Meyer worked hard to create a campaign to improve waste diversion among fellow students at Roosevelt Middle School. As part of that initiative the students, then eighth graders, also sewed and sold reusable bags as alternatives to Ziploc and similar containers. Fifth graders, who were the focus of their campaign, made posters to display what they had learned from McKenzie and Charlotte. These young women are extraordinary role models who used their creativity and talents to explain the importance of sustainability to their peers. They have truly made a difference for River Forest.



A Tax Increment Finance District along North Avenue is progressing. A public hearing was conducted on July 9. Trustees will decide whether to formally adopt the TIF at their August 13 Board Meeting. <u>Click here</u> to read more.

Here is what is coming in September:

On September 17, Trustees anticipate taking up the Development Review Board's recommendation on a proposed mixed use planned development for Lake and Lathrop. Read more about the project by <u>clicking here</u>.

The Village and its consultant, Houseal Lavigne and Associates, will present a draft updated Corridor Plan that was previously approved by the Village Board in 2009 to the Economic Development Commission and Plan Commission for their review and input. The Corridor Plan is focused on the North Avenue, Harlem Avenue, Lake Street and Madison Street areas and will be incorporated into the new Comprehensive Plan. The Village Board will review the <u>Comprehensive Plan</u> this fall.

2018-2019 Vehicle Stickers

The Village of River Forest would like to remind residents to purchase a 2018-2019 vehicle sticker to avoid being ticketed. The deadline for purchasing and displaying vehicle stickers without penalty was July 14th. The late fee on vehicle stickers will be increased from \$10 to \$15 on August 15, 2018. The late fee is in addition to the cost of the sticker.

All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- Online at the Village Website by clicking here.
- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be <u>downloaded here</u>).
- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.

Stickers are \$45 for passenger vehicles and \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens (one senior citizen vehicle sticker per household). Vehicle sticker applications were mailed in late May. If you received an application for a vehicle that you no longer own or a duplicate application, please notify the Village by either calling, or returning the application noting the vehicle's status in the enclosed envelope, so that the vehicle will be removed from our records.

Solicitors - A Message From The River Forest Police Department

On January 1, 2017, the Future Energy Jobs Act took effect in Illinois after being signed by Governor Rauner. As a result, many new companies were created to provide renewable energy to Illinois residents (for more info <u>click here</u>). In order to sell the energy they are creating, they are sending out sales people to get contracts. Some companies are more legitimate than others.

It is important for residents to understand that any agents that come to your door claiming to represent an energy company are subject to the same restrictions as any other solicitor under River Forest village ordinances, which are as follows:

- Solicitors must obtain and possess a valid permit issued by the River Forest Police Department (RFPD). Do not hesitate to ask someone at your door to produce their permit. If they will not or cannot, they are violating the village's ordinance and you should notify RFPD. At the time of this writing, "Constellation Exelon" is the only company that has obtained a Village permit. Other companies currently possessing solicitor's permits include "AT&T", "College Works Painting", "Pointe Pest Control" and "Weed Man" lawn care. "Star Energy Partners" had their solicitor's permit REVOKED by the Chief of Police.
- Even with a permit, no person may solicit at any

premises with signage posted stating "*NO* SOLICITOR" or "*NO* SOLICITORS INVITED" or "*NO* TRESPASSING". The village offers "No Solicitors" window clings on the 2nd floor of the Village Hall.

- Permitted solicitors may only operate 9 AM 8 PM Monday -Saturday, 9 AM -5 PM Sunday, and never on holidays.
- Religious evangelists do not count as solicitors, unless they request donations.

West Nile Virus Season

West Nile Virus season is upon us, and the risk of human infection is increasing. According to the Cook County Department of Public Health, River Forest, at some point during the summer, has had traps that have tested positive for the illness. Anyone can become infected, and we urge you all to take some simple, but important precautions:

- Cover skin with lightly colored loose fitting clothing when outdoors between dusk and dawn.
- Use mosquito repellent with DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus. Always follow the directions on the product label.
- Get rid of standing water around your home in pet bowls, flower pots, old tires, baby pools and toys. Water that is allowed to stagnate for three or four days becomes a breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- Make sure your doors and windows have tightly fitting screens and repair any tears or other openings.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short and keep gutters clean and free of debris.


New Platform Tennis Pro

From the Township Assessor...

The Assessor is hosting a Community Outreach with the Cook County Board of Review on Tuesday, August 21st at 6:30 PM. All residents are invited to attend and will be able to ask the commissioner and staff questions regarding your property assessment and appeal process. Senior and Senior Freeze exemptions must be filed every year in March. If you own your home and were born in the year 1952 or earlier you should apply for Senior/Senior Freeze Exemption. You may only claim a Home Owner, Senior or Senior Freeze exemption on your primary residence.

Announcing the "Support4U" Program

A new program is available to students at Roosevelt, Brooks and Julian Middle Schools and OPRF High School called "Support4U". Support4U is a mental health-related prevention and support resource for students, by which they can text licensed mental health clinicians for assistance or guidance. While students can initiate a text conversation on any issue, some of the matters that students might wish to address could include anxiety, depression, substance use, suicidal ideation, eating disorders, bullying, abuse, or any other mental health-related topic.

Support4U is anonymous and available to students 24/7. We thank Districts 90, 97 and 200 for their support of this program on behalf of their students.
