Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

I hope you all had a restful and safe Fourth of July. There's a lot to report.

Here's what's happened at the Village Board table:

We will help the Historic Preservation Commission increase the visibility of significant homes and historic preservation

award winners that are on the market by listing these important properties on the Village's website. The listing will be voluntary and free. This is a proactive approach to ensure that the 295 homes on the significant properties list are sold to people who see the importance of preservation. A letter will be sent to both homeowners and the Oak Park Board of Realtors.



The Historic Preservation Commission is also wrapping up production of a brochure that will serve as an education piece for residents and anyone interested in historic preservation. The brochure will highlight 32 significant homes and past historic preservation award winners. Similar pamphlets in other communities sparked interest in creating our own. We look

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forward to using this as a showcase of our architectural treasures. To learn more about Historic Preservation, go to the Commission's web page.

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In June, Village Trustees changed rates and designation of spaces for ALL River Forest-owned parking lots. The new rates and designations took effect on July 1. Cash payment boxes are being eliminated, and payment must be made by using Passport Parking. Click here for more information. Also on the table:

The Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District for North Avenue took an important step forward in June when the Joint Review Board unanimously approved its creation. A member of the public and representatives from each taxing district that encompass River Forest are on this important board. A public hearing on the TIF will be held at 7 p.m., July 9, at Village Hall. I anticipate consideration of formal approval of the TIF at the August 13 Village Board of Trustees meeting. Also moving forward is a mixed-use development at Lake and Lathrop. A public hearing was held on June 28 and continued to July 26 at 7 p.m. at Village Hall. If the Development Review Board concludes its deliberations and makes a recommendation to the Village Board this month the Trustees would take action on the matter on Aug. 13. To read more please visit vrf.us/lakeandlathrop.

A public hearing will be held soon for a senior care community proposed for the northwest corner of Harlem and Chicago where TCF Bank and three single-family homes to the north of TCF are located. The project will consist of assisted and memory care living units and is proceeding through the Village's Planned Development application process, the same process that Lake and Lathrop and Lake and Park developments need to follow. Resurfacing of Chicago Avenue from Harlem to Thatcher will start on July 9. Signage will be placed in advance of the work to warn drivers of the pending construction. Chicago Avenue will remain open during construction. The initial project will include sidewalk and crosswalk improvements along with excavation work to create bump-outs with stormwater friendly rain gardens at Keystone, Forest, Jackson and Bonnie Brae.

2018-2019 Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers for 2018-2019 are now available for purchase and must be affixed to your windshield by July 14 to avoid late fees and citations. All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- Online at the Village Website by <u>clicking here</u>.
- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be <u>downloaded here</u>).
- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.

Stickers are \$45 for passenger vehicles and \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens (one senior citizen vehicle sticker per household). Vehicle sticker applications were recently mailed. If you receive an application for a vehicle that you no longer own or a duplicate application, please notify the Village by

either calling, or returning the application noting the vehicle's status in the enclosed envelope, so that the vehicle will be removed from our records.

Junior Citizen's Police Academy - July 16 -July 20

The Village of River Forest Police Department will be hosting its annual Junior Citizen's Police Academy from July 16, 2018 through July 20, 2018. The academy will be held from 9 AM to 3 PM each day and will meet at the River Forest Police Department located at 400 Park Avenue. This is a FREE program for kids between the ages of 10 and 15 who live or go to school in River Forest, Oak Park, or Forest Park.

Safety for the Season

Summer Safety from the River Forest Police Department

Bike Safety

- When cycling in the roadway, ride to the RIGHT (with traffic).
- Cyclists in the roadway must obey the same "rules of the road" as motor vehicles, such as signaling turns, obeying traffic control devices, and right of way.
- When cycling at night, state law requires bikes have a front light (white, visible at 500 feet) and a red reflector in the rear. RFPD recommends also using a red light attached to the rear.
- When cycling, always wear a helmet!

Children may be awarded a coupon for a free Slurpee® by an RFPD officer if they are observed wearing a helmet while riding their bike. This is made possible by a partnership with 7-11 called "Operation Chill"—one which RFPD has participated in for over 10 years.

Curfew

Curfew for juveniles under age 18 in River Forest is 11 PM - 6 AM on weekinghts (Sun.-Thurs.); and 12 AM -6 AM on weekends (Fri.-Sat.). Driving privileges (whether by learner's permit or Graduated Driver's License) for juveniles become invalid one hour prior to curfew (10 PM - 6 AM on weekinghts and 11 PM - 6 AM on weekends.) If a juvenile is encountered driving during this time, he/she could be subject to arrest for the offense of Driving Without a Valid License, a Class A Misdemeanor in the state of Illinois. Additionally, the vehicle may be towed and impounded with an Administrative Fee of \$500 plus towing costs (\$100+).

Driving Safety

RFPD will be partnering this summer with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to reduce injuries and deaths due to traffic collisions. Throughout the summer, RFPD will conduct several traffic safety missions by increasing enforcement and specifically focusing on violations most likely lead to accidents or injuries. In order to stay safe remember the following:

- Always wear your seatbelt while driving—"Click It or Ticket".
- All use of electronic devices must be "hands free" while driving—"Drop It and Drive".
- Do not drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs
 "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over".

Thefts of Tools and Landscaping Equipment:

Theft of construction tools, equipment from construction vehicles, sites, tradesmen's vehicles and lawn maintenance crews increases during the summer months. Workers should remove keys and keep vehicles locked at all times while on the job site. Do not leave trailers open and do not leave equipment unattended.

To assist the police in the recovery of property, record the serial numbers of tools and equipment and have them available on the job site. Consider engraving a unique ID, such as a driver's license number on the tools/equipment to aid the police in returning any tools recovered from thieves.

If you see anyone suspicious or any suspicious activity near your worksite or vehicle, please call 9-1-1. Do not wait to call, call immediately. Try to get a good description of the person or persons, any vehicle information and direction they leave.

Imagine OPRF Working on Long-Term Facilities Master Plan

On June 26, 2018, the District 200 Board of Education held a public meeting for the Imagine team and consulting architects to begin discussions of potential recommendations for a long-term facilities master plan for OPRF High School. Imagine shared two

concepts, based on the past nine months of intensive research and stakeholder input. Based on Board members' feedback and questions, Imagine will present a single refined concept by mid-August (public meeting date and time to be announced). At that time, estimated costs for components of the plan as well as potential phasing of the plan will be presented for discussion. The concept will be further refined after that meeting and presented to the public for input this fall. The goal is for Imagine to make its recommendations to the Board for a long-term facilities master plan later in fall 2018. For more information on the work of Imagine OPRF, click here.
