Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to September. School is back in session, and with it fall sports and other outdoor activities. Please remember to drive carefully around town and watch out for our children walking, running and cycling to and from school.

Since our last newsletter, we have made some progress toward creating a Tax Increment Finance District on Madison Street. In early August, the Village Board announced the availability of revised plans and reports regarding the implementation of a proposed Tax Increment Financing (TIF) district on the Madison Street corridor. These reports are accessible by [clicking here](#).

The Board of Trustees also has set new dates for two public meetings that we must hold as part of the TIF process. Both will be at 6 p.m. at Village Hall. On Sept. 13, the Joint Review Board, which consists of a representative from each taxing body in River Forest and one resident, will recommend to Village Trustees whether the TIF has long term financial merits for their respective units of government. On Oct. 24 a public hearing will be held before the Village Board of Trustees and I. We will take final action on the TIF in November.

We thank the public for its input, which helped make this process a sound one. Their comments have resulted in adding language that would restrict the Village from using eminent domain for any of the residential properties not abutting Madison Street in the commercial corridor. We encourage residents to continue to take part in this process as it offers the transparency that makes local government work.

Should you have any questions about a TIF and how valuable this initiative will be in revitalizing Madison Street, I encourage you to visit a separate page we've set up on our [website](#). If you still have questions and comments about economic development in general, please read [my letter](#) on how economic development will have a major impact on stabilizing our property taxes and increasing our property values.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Village's annual Fall Leaf Collection Program runs from September 19th through November 30th. The next opportunity to dispose of leaves after November 30th will be during the yard waste collection program which starts in April 2017. Rake only leaves onto the street by 7 a.m. on your collection day, leaving the curb exposed, where Village and Strom crews will collect them. Grass clippings, brush or any other type of yard waste mixed with your leaves will not be collected. Leaves are collected on both sides of the street in accordance with the following schedule:

Mondays: The area west of Thatcher including Edgewood, Auvergne, River Oaks and Lake, and all streets south of the Union Pacific Rail

Street Patching

The Village's annual street patching program began today and 176 locations will be patched throughout the Village.

The contractor is Brothers Asphalt Paving and they will likely be in town working on September 2nd, 6th, and 7th. The work consists of milling and replacing 2" of the roadway surface at the designated locations. They are re-installing the patch right behind the removal crew so disturbance to traffic should be extremely minimal. No patches should remain open over the weekend.

High School Board Adopts Facilities Plan and Bond Referendum

The Oak Park and River Forest High School Board has adopted a five-year pool and facilities plan. The plan would replace the 88-year old pools with a new 40-meter pool and garage on the site of the current garage, improve learning spaces, add classrooms to accommodate a more than 20% growth in performing arts class enrollment, and renovate locker rooms to mitigate health and safety issues. The Board intends to finance the project with \$20 million in cash and a bond issue. It has approved a referendum question to be placed on the Nov. 8, 2016, ballot, seeking the community's approval for a bond issue of up to \$25 million. According to estimates provided by William Blair & Company, for a River Forest resident with a median home value of \$530,700, the expected tax impact would be an increase of up to \$136 in property taxes per year.
