Message from the Village President



Dear Residents:

Is it October already? Falling leaves and changing weather let us know that it is time to prepare for fall leaf raking, the Village's annual leaf collection program, as well as all the other outdoor activities that come this time of year. It is also time to get out the Halloween decorations. Trick-or-treating hours have been posted on

the [Village's website](http://www.vrf.us), www.vrf.us, and Halloween safety tips are provided later in the newsletter.

Looking ahead, a final public hearing regarding the Madison Street Tax Increment Finance District will be held during the regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of Trustees on Oct. 24 at 7:00 PM. The Joint Review Board (JRB) met recently and recommended approval of the TIF by majority vote. The JRB's report, testimony from residents, and all other documents related to this initiative will be presented to the Village Board of Trustees for final approval in late November. Information on the TIF District remains available on a [special Village webpage](#). We hope you will continue to find it of value and encourage you to contact the Village Administrator or elected officials if you have questions or concerns.

Village auditors have reviewed the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and have found that River Forest continues to be in good fiscal health and that all financial matters are being reported accurately. To view a copy of the current and previous CAFRs click [here](#).

After conducting a focus group and over 50 interviews of Village residents, elected officials, staff, commission and committee chairpersons, the Village's communications audit is complete.

It will be presented to the Village Board of Trustees and me during our October 10 Board Meeting. With the help of Jasculca Terman Strategic Communications, we have taken the last three months to assess what we are doing well and what could be doing better. The goal of this audit was to evaluate the effectiveness of existing communication strategies, and to identify opportunities for improvement as well as new ways to reach Village residents. The full report is available for viewing and download by [clicking here](#).

To prepare the audit and strategic recommendations, the Village and JT considered the viewpoints and expertise of a wide range of audiences, including residents, local business owners and operators, Village Trustees, Village staff, chairs of Village commissions, representatives of neighboring government entities, and representatives of other Chicagoland municipalities.

The results of this process will be presented to the Village Board of Trustees at their regular meeting on Monday, October 10, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at the River Forest Village Hall (400 Park Avenue, River Forest). The Village Board will consider an implementation plan at a later date, which will include, among other things, enhancements to the Village's website and popular e-newsletter, and an evaluation of the feasibility of a social media presence.

Trick or Treating Hours and Tips for a Safe Halloween

In order to have a safe and fun Halloween, the Village of River Forest has set official trick-or-treating hours from 3 PM to 7 PM on Monday, October 31. Residents are asked to try their best to participate within these hours.

Recently, there have been media reports of people dressed as clowns who have reportedly been chasing children, threatening harm and committing crimes. Many of the concerns have been driven by social media rumors and false reports to the police. The Police Department has been following the issue and has no reason to believe that Village residents face any immediate danger as a result of these incidents. However, reports like these, and the attention they generate, could lead to copycat incidents and/or situations that could be misinterpreted. The Village staff have received calls regarding the matter and whether there are any restrictions on costumes this year. While there are no restrictions, and no plans to implement them, residents are encouraged to consider the appropriateness of clown costumes this Halloween and select an alternative.

Additional Trick-or-Treating Safety Tips from the Village of River Forest:

- Make sure costumes are visible to vehicles and others.
- Instead of a candle to light a pumpkin, use a small flashlight or a liquid light stick that glows in the dark.
- Purchase only flame retardant or flame proof costumes and masks.
- Be sure costumes fit properly to prevent tripping or falling and wear masks that allow full vision.

Do not trick or treat alone.

- Only approach homes that are well lit and only approach the front door.
- Stay on sidewalks and obey traffic signs/signals.
- Carry a flashlight.
- Adults should check their child's candy before they eat it.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Village's annual Fall Leaf Collection Program runs through November 30th. The next opportunity to dispose of leaves after November 30th will be during the yard waste collection program which starts in April 2017. Rake only leaves onto the street by 7 a.m. on your collection day, leaving the curb exposed, where Village and Strom crews will collect them. Grass clippings, brush or any other type of yard waste mixed with your leaves will not be collected. Leaves are collected on both sides of the street in accordance with the following schedule:

Mondays: The area west of Thatcher including Edgewood, Auvergne, River Oaks and Lake, and all streets south of the Union Pacific Rail Road tracks.

Tuesdays: Harlem through and including William.

Wednesdays: Monroe through and including Lathrop, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Thursdays: Ashland through and including Park, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Fridays: Forest through and including Thatcher, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Electronics Recycling Now Available in Burr Ridge!

All residents within the West Cook County Solid Waste Agency Region (which includes River Forest) will be able to drop off Electronics at the Village of Burr Ridge Public Works Department.

The address for drop off is: 451 Commerce Street, Burr Ridge, IL.

The Village would like to remind you that political yard signs may only be displayed on private property. Please do not place any signs in the public right-of-way which includes all parkways.

River Forest WeatherBug Station at Roosevelt

Residents can now access real-time River Forest weather conditions, forecasts, and safety information on their computers and phones. A new WeatherBug weather station sits atop the North Gym at Roosevelt Middle School, overlooking the Park

District fields and the River Forest Public Library. Anyone with an internet connection or mobile app can get the local weather and view Centennial Park.

The station reports Current Conditions (temperature, rainfall, humidity, wind speed/direction, and pressure), Hourly and Daily Forecasts, Doppler radar, and recent Lightning Strikes in the surrounding area.

The weather station is an Eagle Scout Project led by David Snyder, a member of Boy Scout Troop 65 and a junior at OPRFHS (and proud Roosevelt/Lincoln alum). It is meant to ensure the outdoor comfort and safety of River Forest students, Park District participants, and anyone in the Oak Park / River Forest area. As a member station of the global WeatherBug network, it also provides District 90 teachers and students free access to STEM and other educational tools.

OPRF Makes Investment for Future Generations

In its first major facilities upgrade since the 1960s, the Board of Education unanimously adopted a five-year facilities plan in August. The plan will add classroom space, replace the 88-year-old pools, and mitigate health and safety issues in locker rooms. The total cost of the project is \$44.5 million, and the Board has placed a referendum on the November 8 ballot, which will allow voters to determine if \$25 million in bonds should be issued to finance the project.
