Also on our minds is the transition of government. The Board of Trustees and I invite you to attend the Village Board meeting on May 8 at 7 p.m. at the Village

Hall when the newly-elected officials, Trustees Tom Cargie, Patty Henek and Respicio Vazquez, Clerk Kathleen White and myself as Village President will be sworn in.

On May 1, the Village's new fiscal year began and with that, a new <u>budget</u> is in place. It is balanced, it has few frills, but it will fill important Board goals and provide the services that you expect from us.

Last month the Village Board approved the appointments of seven residents who will serve on the community's first Sustainability Commission. The list of Commissioners and their roles and responsibilities are posted on our website or <u>click here</u>.

The Village Board also recognized Jaxon and Miles Toppen, two brothers from Roosevelt Middle School in River Forest, who won the top prize in the elementary/middle school competition of the One Earth Young Filmmakers Contest. All Contractors Must Be Licensed

The Village would like to remind residents that all contractors performing work in the Village must be licensed and bonded. This includes and applies to all landscape services. To obtain a license a contractor must provide the Village with proof of insurance and a surety bond. The insurance protects property owners in the event that the contractor does damage to the property or if a worker is injured. The surety bond acts as a guarantee that the contractor will perform the work in accordance with Village code and other applicable regulations. Know the Code!

The Village would like to provide the following notes regarding Landscaping and Yard Waste:

- Grass clippings, leaves, tree trimmings or any other yard or landscape waste cannot be deposited in any street, alley, or other public place.
- Grass and weeds may not exceed 8 inches in height and must be cut within 5 days after notice by Village.
- Trees and shrubs cannot overhang on sidewalks or streets in such a way as to impede or interfere with traffic or travel. This must be maintained by the owner.
- If a tree or tree limb has become likely to fall on or across any public street, sidewalk or place it must be removed by the owner.
- Properly packaged yard waste to be picked up "curbside", may not be put out prior to 6 PM on Monday (the day before yard waste collection) and will be picked up on Tuesday. For alley collection, properly packaged yard waste may be placed for collection next to the regular garbage collection point.

River Forest Township: Building on 100 Years of Vital Human Services

River Forest Township turns 100 in 2017! Your Township funds and supports a full array of vital human services to youth, seniors, those with mental health needs, and those in financial need...in addition to our active Assessor's office.

In April 1917, River Forest (with a population then of 3000) voted by referendum to create its own township, thereby separating from Proviso Township. The River Forest Village Board passed the necessary resolution in June 1917 in support of the referendum. The Cook County Board formally approved the new River Forest Township in October 1917, making it official.

Your Township continues to ensure that funds are preserved and allocated for the necessary human services and assessor services in our community.

Township Assessor's Office Services Over 25% of Property Owners

River Forest recently underwent a property tax triennial reassessment. During the appeals process, your Township Assessor's Office assisted and serviced over 25% of River Forest property owners.

During the busy appeals period, the Township Assessor's office handled 622 phone calls, 284 emails, 105 visitors, 383 appeal packets, 136 exemptions, 90 community outreach event, 66 other requests.

Many thanks to the Township Assessor's Office for working overtime to help River Forest property owners navigate the reassessment process.

New Restaurant Added to Senior "Dine-Out Program"

Oak Park and River Forest Township Senior Services announces the addition of a 4th Oak Park restaurant in the "Dine-Out Program", which offers seniors a tasty, affordable, well-balanced meal at specified local restaurants. Geppetto's now joins Robinson's Ribs, Cozy Corner and Grape Leaves in the program's restaurant lineup.

Seniors can purchase Dine-Out Program coupons for \$4/meal at Township Senior Services (130 S. Oak Park Ave, Oak Park). Coupons are then used to purchase a meal at participating restaurants from a pre-approved healthy menu.

Seniors must first register at Township Senior Services in Oak Park and obtain a program ID. Coupons can then be purchased there on Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays from 9 AM-noon, or by mail.

Only coupons can be used to pay for Dine-Out Program meals, but we ask participants to consider tipping the wait staff. Questions: please call Township Senior Services at 708-383-8060.

Condo Association meeting? Block Party? Distribute ICE Packets to Seniors!

If you have a condo association meeting or a block party coming up soon, your Township staff is happy to attend and deliver free ICE Packets for senior residents.

What is an ICE Packet? The ICE Packet contains a Medical Information Form which seniors fill out and store in the freezer... right where the River Forest paramedics know to find it In Case of Emergency (ICE)! A decal is provided for the front of the freezer to alert paramedics that a completed ICE Packet is inside.
