The River Forest Police Department hopes everyone enjoyed the holidays and received everything on their wish lists. Now that December 26, the unofficial "National Day of Returns" has passed, we assume you want to keep and protect your new gifts and gadgets. One simple but important step to protecting your property is to determine if an item possesses a unique serial number, and if so, to notate that serial number in a safe location. Vehicles, bicycles, tools, and most electronics will possess a serial number etched, stamped or affixed on them in some way. By notating the serial numbers, you can provide them to police if the items are ever lost or stolen. This is crucial because law enforcement officials can enter the item's serial number into the state-wide stolen property database. If any officers encounter your property and check the serial number in the database, not only will they immediately be able to identify it as lost or stolen, but they will be able to find out where it was reported stolen so that it can be returned to you. Having the serial number also helps police locate property that has been sold to a pawn shop.

Bicycle serial numbers are usually located on the underside of the bottom bracket (where the pedals connect to the bike frame). Some mobile devices with removable batteries will have the serial number printed inside the device under the battery. Other mobile devices which cannot be opened (such as iPhones) may have the serial number listed on the packaging, otherwise it may be found within the software of the device. If you cannot find a serial number, refer to your owner's manual or research online to determine the location. Just make sure that the number you notate is the unique serial number and not the common model number.

New Law of Note for 2017

Approaching Disabled Vehicles (ILCS 625 5/11-907.5)

Drivers on a highway of at least four-lanes, with two lanes proceeding in the same direction, approaching a disabled vehicle with its hazard lights flashing, must make a lane change into the lane not adjacent to the vehicle. If it would be unsafe or impossible to make the lane change, the driver must reduce speed of vehicle.

This law is an addition to an already existing law called "Scott's Law", which mandates drivers to move over or slow down for stopped emergency vehicles. Scott's Law was named after Lieutenant Scott Gillen of the Chicago Fire Department who was struck and killed by an intoxicated driver while assisting at a crash on the Dan Ryan Expressway. Harlem Avenue and North Avenue are examples of four-lane highways which would apply under this law.

Know the Code!

With the winter continuing, the Village would like to remind you:

- Village code requires residents and business owners to

remove snow and ice from sidewalks in front of and adjacent to their property within 24 hours after an event.

- Snow or ice frozen on sidewalks that cannot be removed without injury to the pavement should be treated with an abrasive material until weather permits further clean-up.
- Parking on Village streets is prohibited after snow exceeds two inches in depth, and for an eight hour period following the cessation of the snowfall.
- Snow removal contractors are prohibited from using snow blowers between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m.
- The placement of snow or ice on any Village owned street, alley or sidewalk is prohibited.

OPRF High School Board Hires Permanent Superintendent

The District 200 Board of Education is pleased to announce that it has unanimously approved the hiring of Joylynn Pruitt-Adams, Ed.D., as permanent superintendent. Dr. Pruitt-Adams, who has been serving as interim superintendent since July 1, 2016, was chosen after a months-long national search that drew 48 candidates from 12 states and sought input from several dozen local stakeholders, including faculty, staff, students, administrators, parents, and community members. Seniors: Make sure you have an ICE (In Case of Emergency) Packet in your freezer! The ICE Packet contains a Medical Information Form which you fill out and store in the freezer...right where the River Forest paramedics know to find it in an emergency! A decal is provided for the front of the freezer to alert paramedics that you have a completed ICE Packet inside.
