### Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to February! Winter has not yet descended upon us, but there is still plenty of time for snow and cold temperatures.

The Village is deep into preparing the budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017, which begins May 1. The Board of Trustees and I got our first glimpse of the Village's capital needs for the maintenance and

improvement of Village streets, sidewalks and alleys, water and sewer infrastructure and Village buildings, as well as vehicle and equipment replacements. In March the Board will examine the proposed budget, which will include revenue projections and operating expenses for police and fire services, administration, pensions, insurance and other items associated with the day-to-day functions of village government. I can assure you the Board and I will adopt a balanced budget that will bring you the high quality services you expect while we continue to stabilize property taxes.

We are also keeping a watchful eye on the budget impasse in Springfield and the impact that it could have on the Village's bottom line. The Village can temporarily draw from its reserves, if necessary, but we must continue to insist that our state lawmakers and our governor pass a budget that has little to no impact on local government revenues. The stalemate is making it challenging for villages, schools and other units of government that need a share of income taxes to fund their services, and it is equally difficult for community organizations to provide the necessary services for our most vulnerable.

The Board of Trustees and I will consider possible amendments proposed by the Historic Preservation Commission to the historic preservation ordinance at the regularly scheduled Village Board Meeting on Monday, February 22 at 7 p.m. The meeting will be held at Lincoln Elementary School and all residents are invited to attend. The proposed amendments will impact historically

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significant homes as well as local landmarks. Please visit the Village's website next week to view a copy of the proposed amendments. The foundation of our community is built on the homes that give River Forest character; they make our community a desirable place to live. Through preservation and restoration, we will breathe life into our motto: "Proud Heritage, Bright Future."

Over the past year or more the Village has been planning to create Tax Increment Finance districts along Madison Street and North Avenue. The Board authorized a market study to determine the types of development best suited for the proposed TIF Districts. In a recent presentation to the Village Board, the Village's consultant reported that a mixture of retail and residential (what is called "mixed-use development") is best suited for Madison Street. Development along North Avenue will be more challenging because of the commercial buildings' proximity to the homes behind them. The study also reaffirmed that River Forest is in a competitive market. I am confident that the Village can gather its resources to attract suitable business that will help increase property values and foster the community's reputation as a desirable place to shop and visit.

Finally, please join me in extending a hearty CONGRATULATIONS to our very own Addison Osta Smith! Addison is the first female and, at 9 years of age, the youngest competitor to earn the title of Master Chef Junior.

### Property Taxes Due March 1

By now you should have received your 1st installment property tax bill. If not, please contact the Assessor's Office, 708.366.2787, for assistance in obtaining a duplicate. This bill is 55% of the total amount of taxes you paid in the previous year. **Property tax payments are due March 1.** All exemptions and changes to your 2015 assessment will be taken into account on your 2nd installment tax bill that usually comes out in July.

We are assisting seniors with their senior exemptions. All seniors must file for their senior exemptions every year. For help completing the forms, please call 708.366.2787 for a weekday appointment or attend walk-in hours, Thursdays 10 am – noon. We are also able to assist new home owners with the home owner exemption paperwork.

We are in the last year of a tri-annual assessment period. If you have recently received a reassessment notice from the Cook County Assessor increasing your assessed value, now is the time to file an appeal. River Forest Township will be open for appeals until Monday, February 29th. Appeals are filed online at the Cook County Assessor website. We can assist you in finding comparable properties.
