Welcome to November. With the holiday season fast Package Theft—'Tis approaching, it promises to be a busy time for us all.

Last month Trustees unanimously approved a senior Holiday Shopping living facility at Chicago and Harlem thereby addressing a long-standing community need. This decision was carefully thought through, Parking after Snowfall acknowledging the concerns that neighbors had about this development. The 125-unit assisted living and

memory care community will benefit River Forest in a variety of ways. It will Special Message from generate nearly \$700,000 in property taxes, third largest behind Town Center I and West Suburban Medical Center Complex. Beyond that, it will allow seniors, and those who want to stay in their homes as long as possible, the ability to remain in River Forest when they need assisted care. We anticipate that organizations, such as the Public Library and the Township, can collaborate on programming that will allow seniors and young people to mingle and learn from one another. We anticipate completion in late 2020, and we will keep you apprised of how this important project progresses. This is a good time to step back and briefly explain the development review ^{SPOTLIGHT} process and how large projects like this are considered in River Forest. This process guides the Village toward looking at the right development at the right location at the right time. The chart below describes what notices and steps are required by state law and Village code when a project is proposed. The Village imposes twice as many steps for the developer to ensure the applications are thoroughly vetted. Although some might think this process is not business friendly, we believe this puts the residents and the Useful Links community first, and then the developer next. The <u>Comprehensive Annual Financial Report and Audit</u> (CAFR) for the fiscal year that ended April 30, 2018 was completed and approved at the October 15 Village Board meeting. I am pleased to report that the audit of the Village's financial condition, conducted by BKD, LLP, a firm of licensed independent auditors, issued a clean opinion on the Village's financial statements. The Village continues to receive awards recognizing its practice of going beyond the minimum requirements and preparing a CAFR that evidences the spirit of transparency and full disclosure. Congratulations to our Administration, with special recognition to Joan Rock, our Finance Director, for a job well done!

At its October 17, 2018 meeting, the Village's Traffic and Safety Commission sent the initial draft report on the Safe Walking Routes to School back to the Administration for further review. The report, done in collaboration with River Forest Elementary School District 90, addresses safe walking routes, crossing guard placement and signage, and other pedestrian hazards affecting how public and parochial students can bike and walk safely to school. At the next Village Board Meeting, which will be held Monday, November 26, the Trustees and I will discuss a proposed update to the Village's building codes. These codes help to ensure that buildings are constructed in a safe, high-quality manner.

Also, as I write this, the Village staff has already begun preparing the next five-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). The CIP is a planning tool that identifies major projects and funding requirements to ensure Village facilities, vehicles, equipment and critical infrastructure (such as sidewalks, roadways and water mains) remain in good working order. This document will be presented to the Village Board for review in January and incorporated into next year's budget.

Chicago Avenue Resurfacing Project

With the Chicago Avenue Resurfacing Project nearing completion, there are a few remaining steps that will impact vehicle and pedestrian traffic. Miscellaneous concrete items and sod installation are being completed now through the week of November 5th. Preparations are also being made to begin paving the final layer of asphalt next Tuesday, November 6th. Impacts will be similar to those during the installation of the first layer of asphalt, however, the new pavement will now be joined to all the existing side-street pavement to remove all bumps throughout the corridor. To improve the bond between the first and second layers of asphalt, a thin layer of a liquidasphalt product will once again be applied, this time to the first layer of asphalt (similar work was performed on the road base before the first layer of asphalt was installed). This liquid is expected to dry out over the course of a few hours. Before it has dried, however, vehicles traveling at higher rates of speed may spray the material up onto the body of the vehicle via the tires. In an effort to avoid this from happening the contractor will once again be applying the material overnight, this time at approximately 1AM on Tuesday, November 6th. The goal is to have the material dried by the time morning rush hour traffic begins. Paving will start later in the day on Tuesday and will likely take two to three days to complete. If any rescheduling is required due to inclement weather, additional notice will be provided.

Thanksgiving Holiday Parking

Will family be visiting this year? Do they need somewhere to park? Contact the Police Records division Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM for answers: 708-366-8500 x 345, and use our 24/7 non-emergency line to call for permission to park a vehicle on the street overnight: 708-366-7125. Please stop by the Village Hall for a free refrigerator magnet that keeps parking and other important contact information within reach.

The Overnight Parking Ban will be lifted from Wednesday, 11/21 (12:01 AM) through Monday, 11/26 (9:00 AM). No overnight waivers will be required during this period.

Reminder - parking is not permitted on any Village street after two inches of snow or more has accumulated on the street, and for up to eight hours after the snowfall ends, to allow snow plows to safely clear the street.

Package Theft—'Tis the Season

During the holidays, more people take advantage of online shopping. Criminals also take advantage of the fact that there are more unattended packages for them to steal. If you are having packages delivered to your home, here are some tips to avoid becoming a victim of package theft:

- If possible, have packages delivered to your workplace.
- Have packages delivered to a place where they can be received in person, such as the home of a trusted neighbor who stays home during the day, or a retired relative.
- Request the shipper require a signature confirmation or hold your package at their pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience.
- If available, request store delivery.
- Request a specific delivery date and time from the shipper when you know you will be home.
- Provide delivery instructions to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is out of sight from the street.
- Sign up for delivery alerts from the shipper.

Holiday Shopping

Criminals will take advantage of the busy crowds at retail stores and restaurants during the holidays by being able to blend in and using distractions. A common crime we see in River Forest is "pick-pocketing" where criminals target unattended purses and backpacks. Usually the victim

has a false sense of security due to the fact that their property is nearby, such as in a shopping cart or hanging on the chair they are sitting in. However, the criminal knows that the victim really is not watching the property and will remove a wallet or valuables from inside the bag without the victim noticing. Remember to be aware of your surroundings and do not leave your property unattended or even out-of-view.

When you are shopping, remember to secure any purchased items in your trunk or out-of-view from the outside so your vehicle is not a target for burglary.

Parking after Snowfall

We are hoping for a mild winter, but please remember that the Village prohibits parking on any street or alley after two inches or more of snowfall for an eight hour period or until the streets are clear. This helps our dedicated Public Works department to their jobs to keep our streets clean and safe from road hazards. The Village will not grant overnight parking passes during the above conditions.

Know the Code

As fall comes to a close, please remember to rake only leaves into the street. All other landscape waste must be bagged for pickup. Please also be sure to properly dispose of pumpkins - no pumpkins should be left at the curb or raked into the street.

Seniors and Free/Reduced RTA Fares

River Forest Township has been receiving many calls regarding senior fares on the RTA, which includes CTA, Metra and PACE. Seniors are entitled to an automatic 50% fare reduction when they turn 65 and complete the application process. Disabled seniors or reduced-income seniors are eligible to apply for free fares. Support Group for Those Who Have Lost a Loved One to Suicide
