VILLAGE OF RIVER FOREST DEER MANAGEMENT AD HOC COMMITTEE Tuesday, June 16, 2020

A regular meeting of the Village of River Forest Deer Management Ad Hoc Committee was held on Tuesday, June 16, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. in the Community Room of Village Hall, 400 Park Avenue – River Forest, IL.

1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. Upon roll call, the following persons were:

2. APPROVAL OF ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION

Management Analyst Phyfer stated that on Friday, June 12, 2020 Governor Pritzker signed a law which allows public bodies to conduct remote meetings under certain conditions, permanently amending the Open Meetings Act. She stated that going forward, approval of electronic participation is no longer necessary and that all votes must be roll call votes.

6. REPORTS FROM SUBCOMMITTEES

Chairperson Cargie clarified his previous statements about the intergovernmental agreement with the Forest Preserves. He stated there are some fixed costs but that there are also variable costs based on the number of deer involved, such as butchering the meat. The Committee reached a consensus to have the Communication Subcommittee meet and discuss how to lay out a Village webpage related to the Committee's activities.

7. OLD BUSINESS

a. Continued Discussion and Consideration for Approval of the River Forest Deer Questionnaire

The Committee discussed the questionnaire at length. There was a consensus that Tim Preuss' suggestions limited the focus of the questionnaire too much to property damage. There was consensus to accept the objective in the Survey Subcommittee's draft.

The Committee discussed the merits of Question 3 ("How do you feel about deer?") on the Survey Subcommittee's draft.

Ms. Armstrong made a motion, seconded by Ms. Christmas to keep Question 3 in the questionnaire.

The Committee discussed the questions related to acceptable solutions to deer conflict management programs and committing public funds towards a culling program, and they ultimately reached a consensus to blend two questions together. The Committee reached a consensus to add the underlined portion to the question "What kind of deer conflict management program is acceptable to you <u>(with use of public funds)</u>?" and to remove the question "Do you believe the Village of River Forest should take action on resolving deer conflicts in the Village of River Forest?"

Trustee Cargie stated that next week the Committee would meet to consider for approval the final version of the questionnaire and to discuss communication options. He reminded the Committee they would be creating a post card to mail to all the households in the Village.
