A regular meeting of the Village of River Forest Deer Management Ad Hoc Committee was held on Tuesday, November 17, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. in the Community Room of Village Hall, 400 Park Avenue – River Forest, IL.

1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order at 7:38 p.m. Upon roll call, the following persons were:

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mary Vanker, 1234 Monroe. Ms. Vanker expressed concerns about the way information was being presented in the packet, with particular regard to the maps. She stated they do not reflect the responses accurately and stated the materials are misleading.

Chairperson Cargie commented that Staff has no goal and are simply providing information that was requested.

6. NEW BUSINESS

a. Vote on Removal of Responses from Non-Residents in Questionnaire Results

b. Discussion of Questionnaire Findings

The Committee discussed the maps and questionnaire comments and noted there are strong feelings about this issue in the community. The Committee also discussed the County Forest Preserves' role in the culling process. Some members expressed concern about the lack information from the County.

Chairperson Cargie that the County has prioritized culling in other areas and that they indicated they would have a culling program if the Village provided the funding. He stated the Forest Preserves did not complete a formal study or formal survey but that their response has been that the habitat had been sufficiently destroyed to justify culling.

The Committee discussed the questionnaire comments and how the questions were worded. Member noted the need for education about this issue and what kinds of programs are possible and realistic. It was also noted the decision is cull or do not cull because there is no option to use contraceptives or to relocate deer.

The Committee also discussed how to interpret the questionnaire results, including whether responses should be qualified in some way. There was also discussion about respondents who reported having issues and how they answered Question 13.

Some members expressed concern about needing to do something for the residents who have said the deer are negatively affecting them. Other members expressed concern that other options could be implemented and tried first prior to resorting to culling.

Chairperson Cargie reminded the Committee the Intergovernmental Agreement was for a 5-year program, up to 50 deer per year, \$40,000 per year or \$200,000 total, and that the Village could opt-out each year.

The Committee discussed the responses to each question. It was noted that deer are seen throughout the community and there was a brief discussion about the seasonality of deer sightings. There was more discussion about how to qualify Question 7 and how to characterize the issues people are experiencing.

There was discussion about what other options are available, and it was reiterated that contraceptives and relocation are not options. There was a question about whether catch and euthanize was an option, and it was noted it would be more expensive than a sharpshooter program.

In response to a comment from Ms. Madden, Chairperson Cargie expressed the challenges the Committee faces having this discussion and requested the members be respectful of one another and their opinions.

There was discussion about taking a more three-dimensional approach to the analysis, including identifying the severity levels of respondents' concerns, regardless of whether those concerns are realistic or perceived.

Chairperson Cargie stated the Committee has until the end of the year and directed the subcommittee chairs to meet and agree on a format for collating the comments, then to meet with their respective subcommittees. He then asked that each subcommittee give a report at the next meeting.

There was discussion about preparing an analysis of the data in more dimensions.

Chairperson Cargie stated that to discuss it meaningfully, material would need to be returned to Staff for publishing in the packet.

c. Discussion of Committee Report

This item was not discussed separately.

d. Discussion of Deer Management Information for Village Website

This item was not discussed.

The Committee members came to a consensus to hold the next meeting on Tuesday, December 15 at 7:30pm.

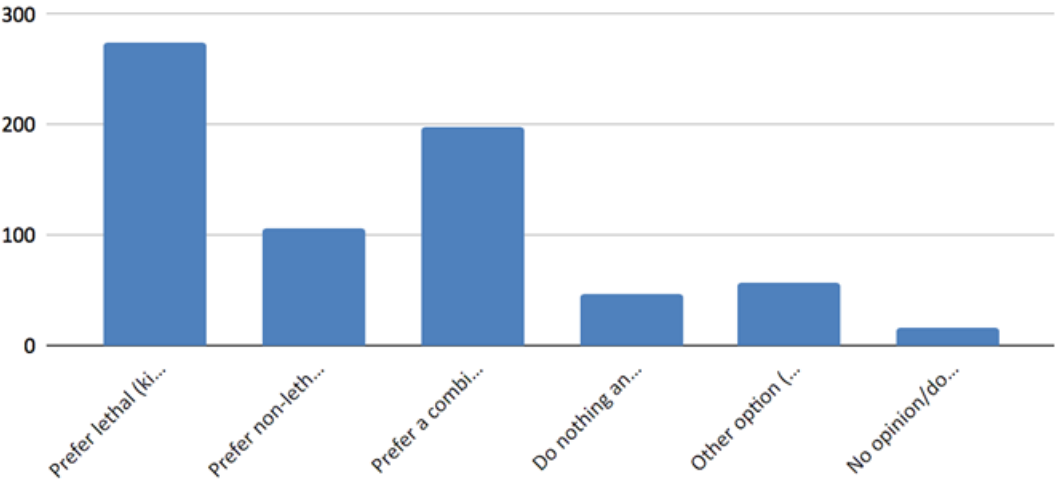

Results from the Deer Survey

Out of the 400 Surveyed:

- 88 specifically said they do not support culling the herd, or prefer "humane" ways of resolving the numbers
- 51 said they do support culling the herd
 - 14 said to they were in support of culling the herd, only if necessary and warranted
 - 3 said they were in partial support of culling the herd and preferred that only some of the deer be culled
- 68 commented they don't have any issue with the deer and didn't mention culling at all
- 21 people said not to use tax dollars to cull the herd
- 55 said they enjoy seeing the deer
 - Some were also in favor of controlling the population
- 36 stated or inferred that there are too many deer but did not propose a solution

Several reported that they have concern or complaints. The most common complaints of concerns include:

- Potential car collisions - 28
 - 2 people said they struck a deer
 - 1 said she had witnessed 3 accidents with deer
- Destruction of plants - 32
 - 6 reported they have spent thousands of dollars replacing plants
 - 4 reported concerns over the forest preserve plants
- Potentially attacking or striking people or dogs - 17
- Deer are afraid of humans - 20
- Lyme or other tick-borne disease - 21
- Deer are unhealthy or too thin - 18

- Feces in the yard - 11
- Damage to home property such as fences
 - 4 instances reported of deer being impaled,
 - 1 report of fence being knocked over

Many comments on suggestions of solutions. The following were suggested:

- Provide education on deer resistant plants
- Create mandates to stop feeding the deer
 - Many reported witnessing others feed the deer
 - Several suggested imposing fines for feeding the deers
- Feed the deer in the preserves so they won't be hungry
- Provide flood control
- Investigate birth control - 9 people asked about birth control
- Reduce speed on streets with speed bumps and signs
- Try to relocate the deer
- Use scientific methods to evaluate and provide evaluation of the herd numbers, and use scientific methods to show there are actually diseased animals and changes in vegetation, etc.
 - 12 people mentioned the lack of such methods

Deer Herd To Be Reduced At Darien-Area Preserve

© Google Maps Residents in the Tara Hill subdivision have been notified that the forest preserve plans to reduce the deer herd at Oldfield Oaks.

DARIEN, IL — Deer from the Oldfield Oaks Forest Preserve are making their way into Darien neighborhoods, an indication of overpopulation, officials said Monday.

Recently, residents in the Tara Hill subdivision have received letters from the DuPage County Forest Preserve District that it plans to reduce a portion of the deer herd in the park, Ward 5 Alderwoman Mary Sullivan said during a City Council meeting.

The residents "were just concerned and questioned why that needed to be done," Sullivan said. "I explained that it was a forest preserve decision, not a city decision."

Dan Gombac, the city's municipal services director, told the council that such a culling of the herd took place about a dozen years ago.

"We've seen situations where some of the deer get into neighborhoods, and unfortunately, we have removed deer that impaled themselves on fences, believe it or not," Gombac said. "When they start to mate, it can really get out of hand."

Sullivan agreed that deer are seen in town.

"There's a lot of them. They're definitely making their way down the street all the time and definitely a bit out of sorts," she said. "They're leaving the forest preserve and milling about, obviously looking for food."

Tony Martinez, the forest preserve's spokesman, couldn't be reached for immediate comment.

Subj: Maps for Questionnaire Responses

Issue: As you know, the Village created several maps at the request of Committee members to provide more context to the questionnaire responses and assist in the Committee's discussion. These maps are attached, which have already been shared with you.

The heat map and plot point map show where in town deer sightings are being reported. These were created using the response to Q4 (in the past 12 months, have you seen deer on your property?) and connecting it to the address provided by that respondent. Similar maps were created for Q13 (what kind of deer conflict management program is acceptable to you?) and Q14 (how do you feel about the current number of deer in your neighborhood?).

While reviewing the maps, please note the following:

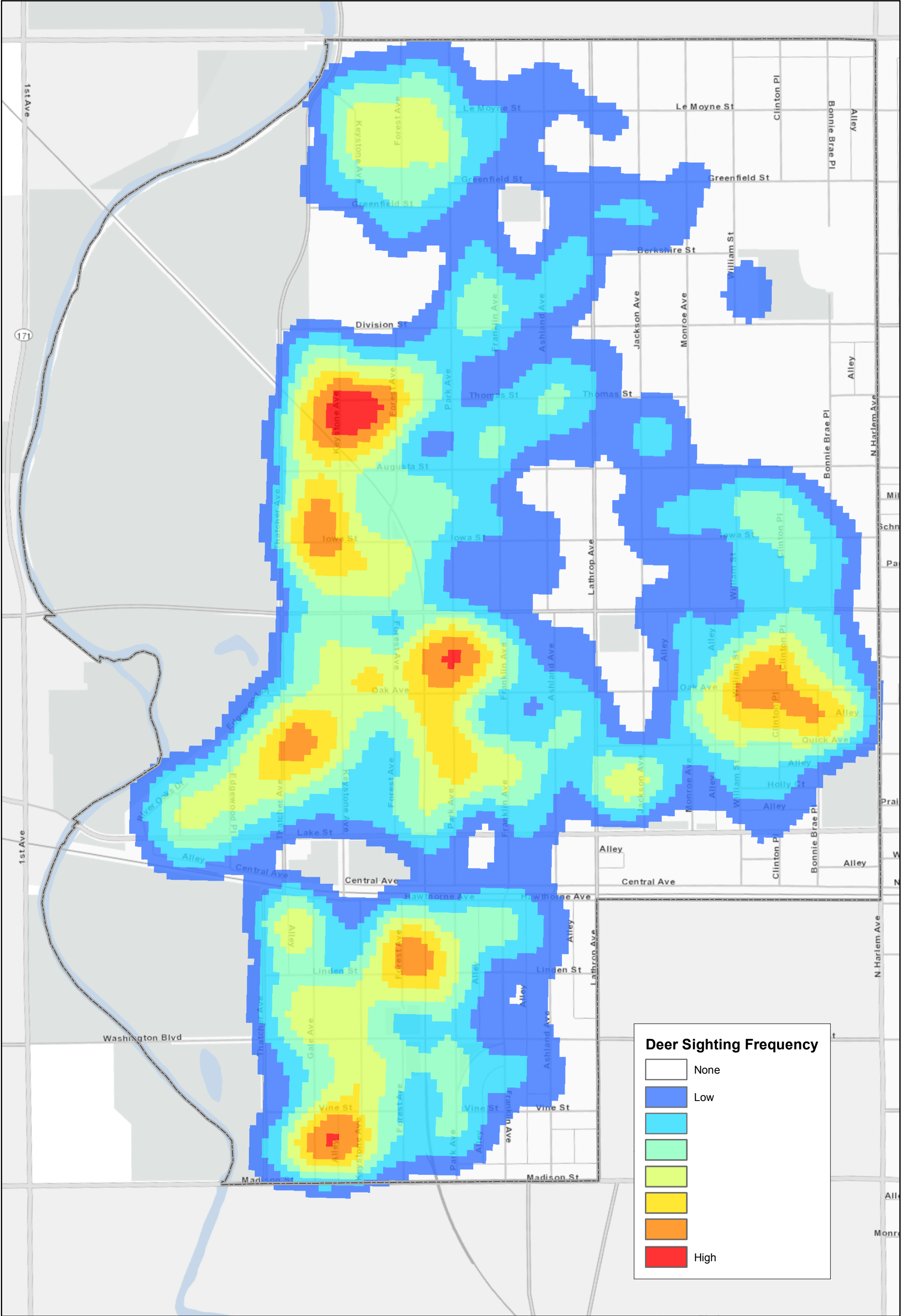
- For all the maps, Staff only plotted points where the respondent provided an actual address (as opposed to the block or intersection).
- For Q4, the plot point map does not include how *many* deer people are reporting, but the dots are colorized to show how individuals responded to the question, including those who reported "never." The heat map shows this more generically.
- For Q4, the maps do not take any other answers into account. They do not reflect respondents' opinions on what, if anything, should be done regarding deer. They are only intended to visualize the reported sightings with a little more context.
- On the Q13 and Q14 maps, each response is separated out into its own map because it is too difficult to read if the responses are all on the same map (particularly since there is no scale similar to the deer sighting frequency map).

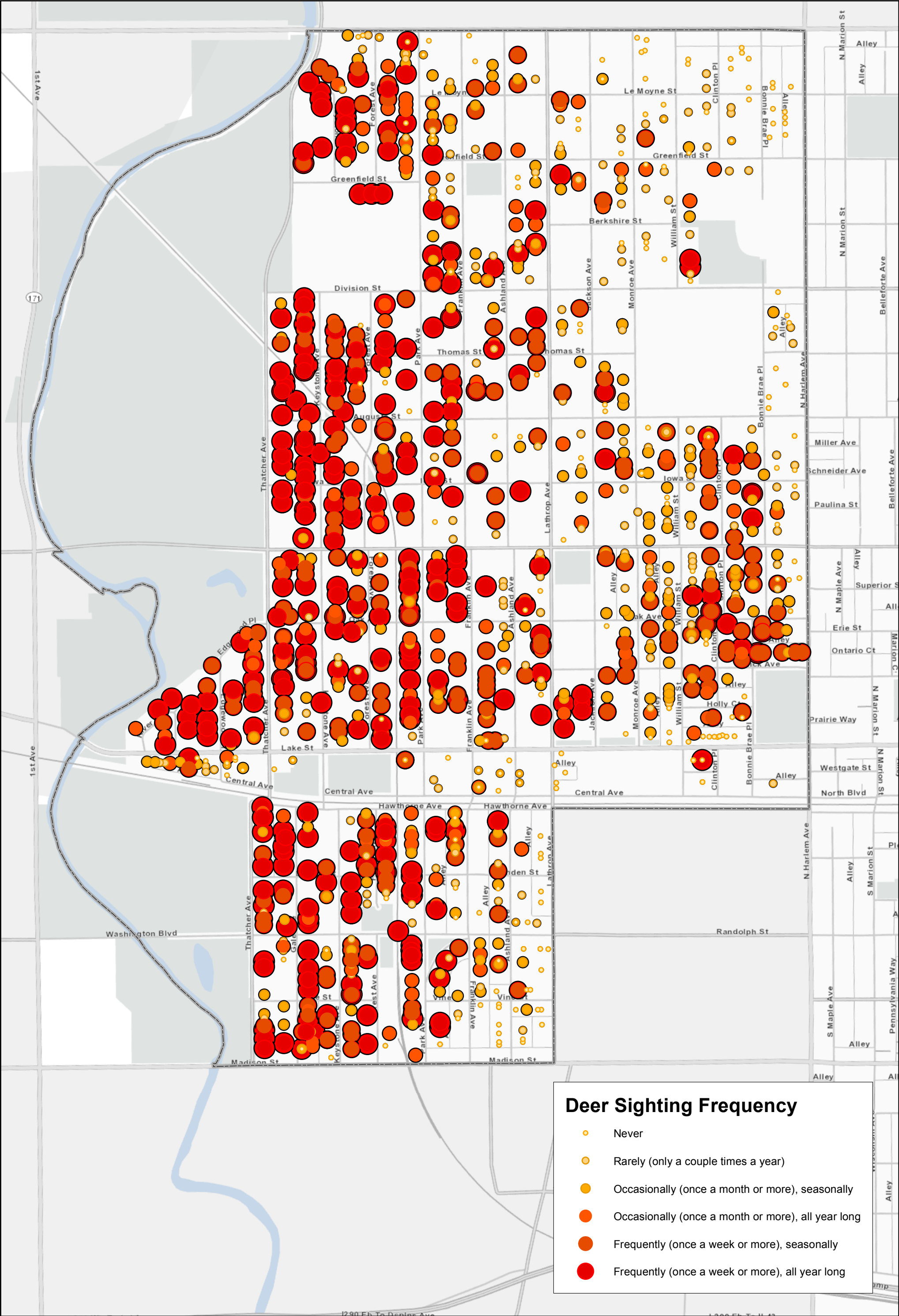
Deer Questionnaire Responses

Plotted 9/1/20



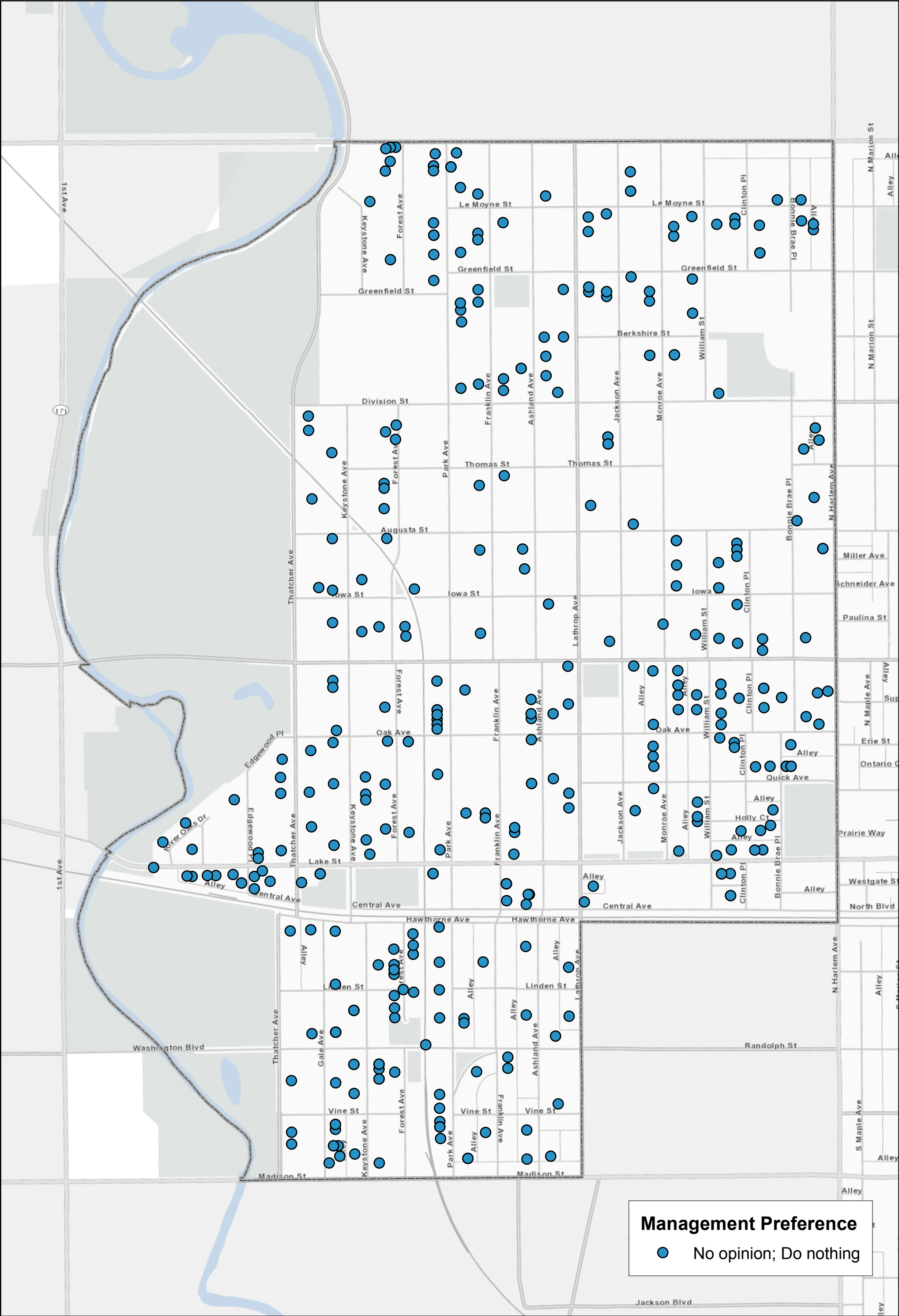

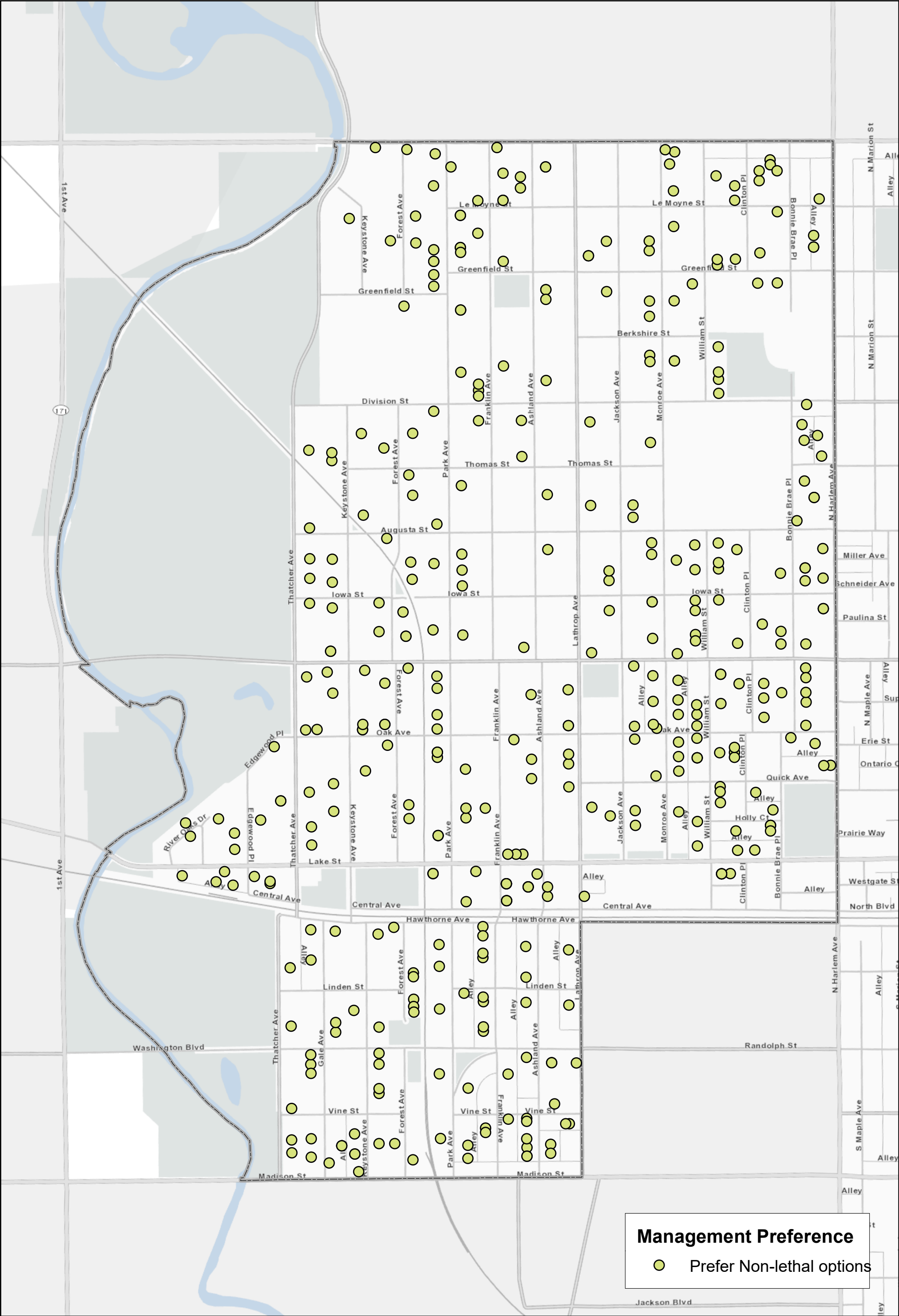
Deer Survey Responses: Question 13

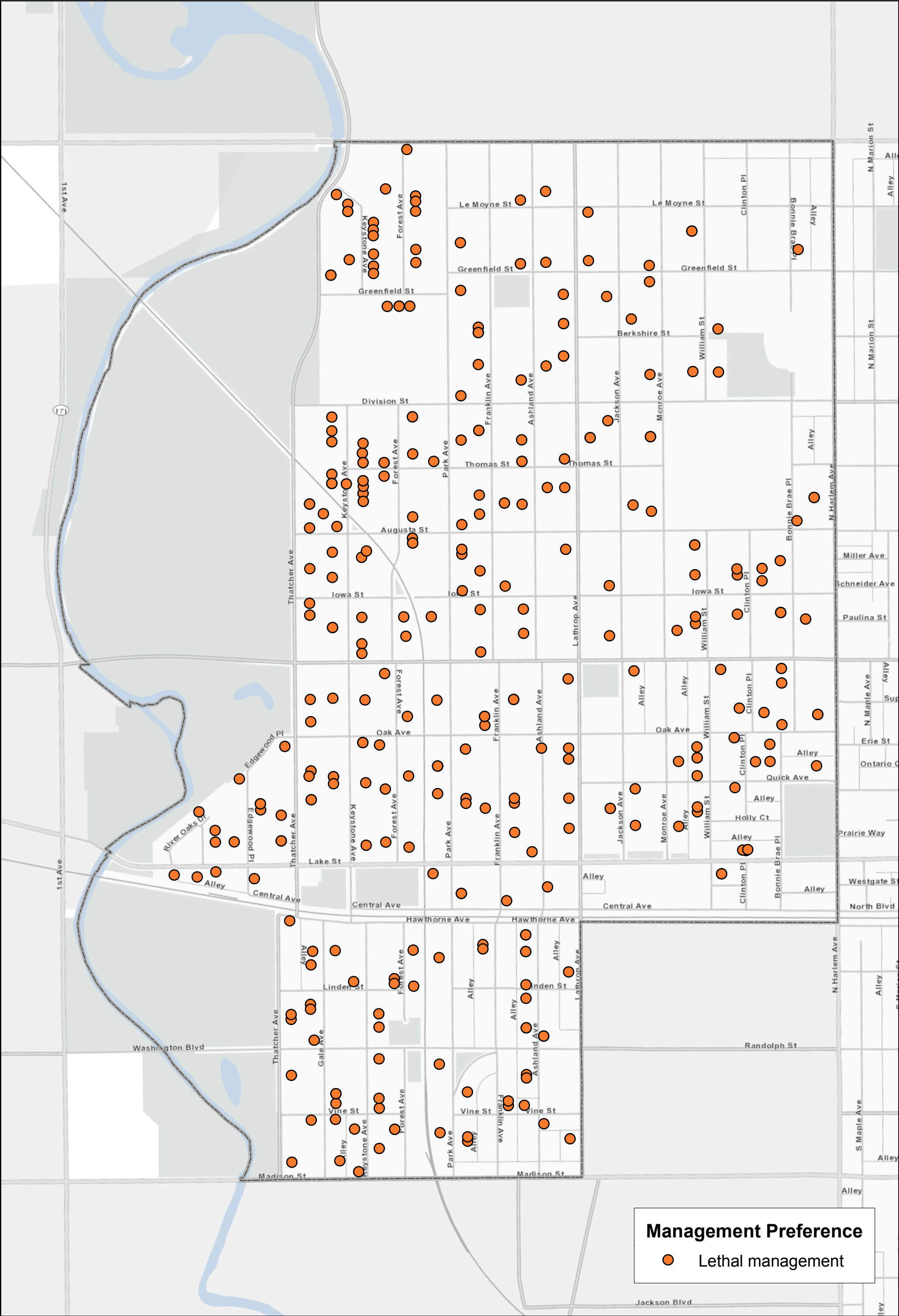

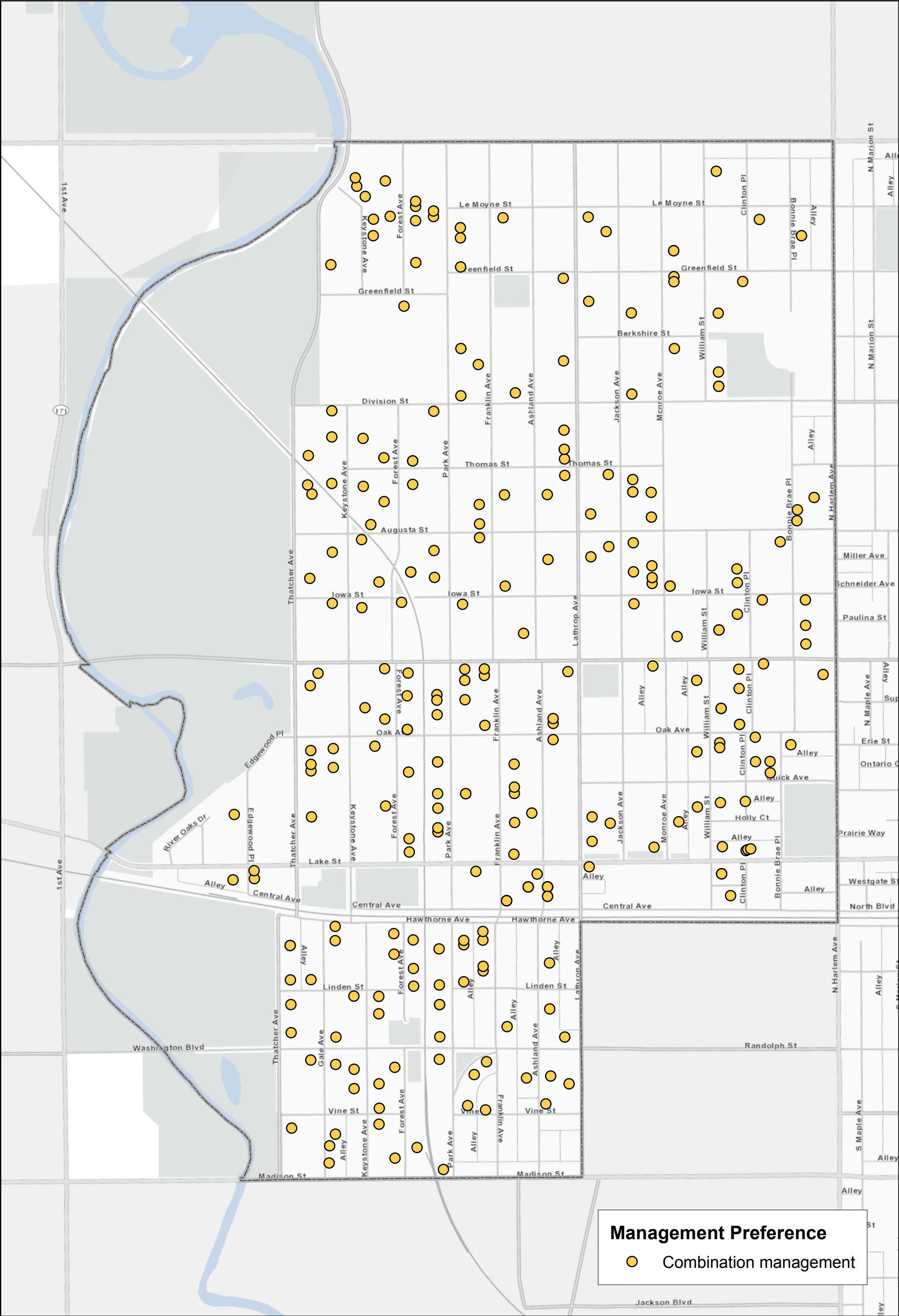

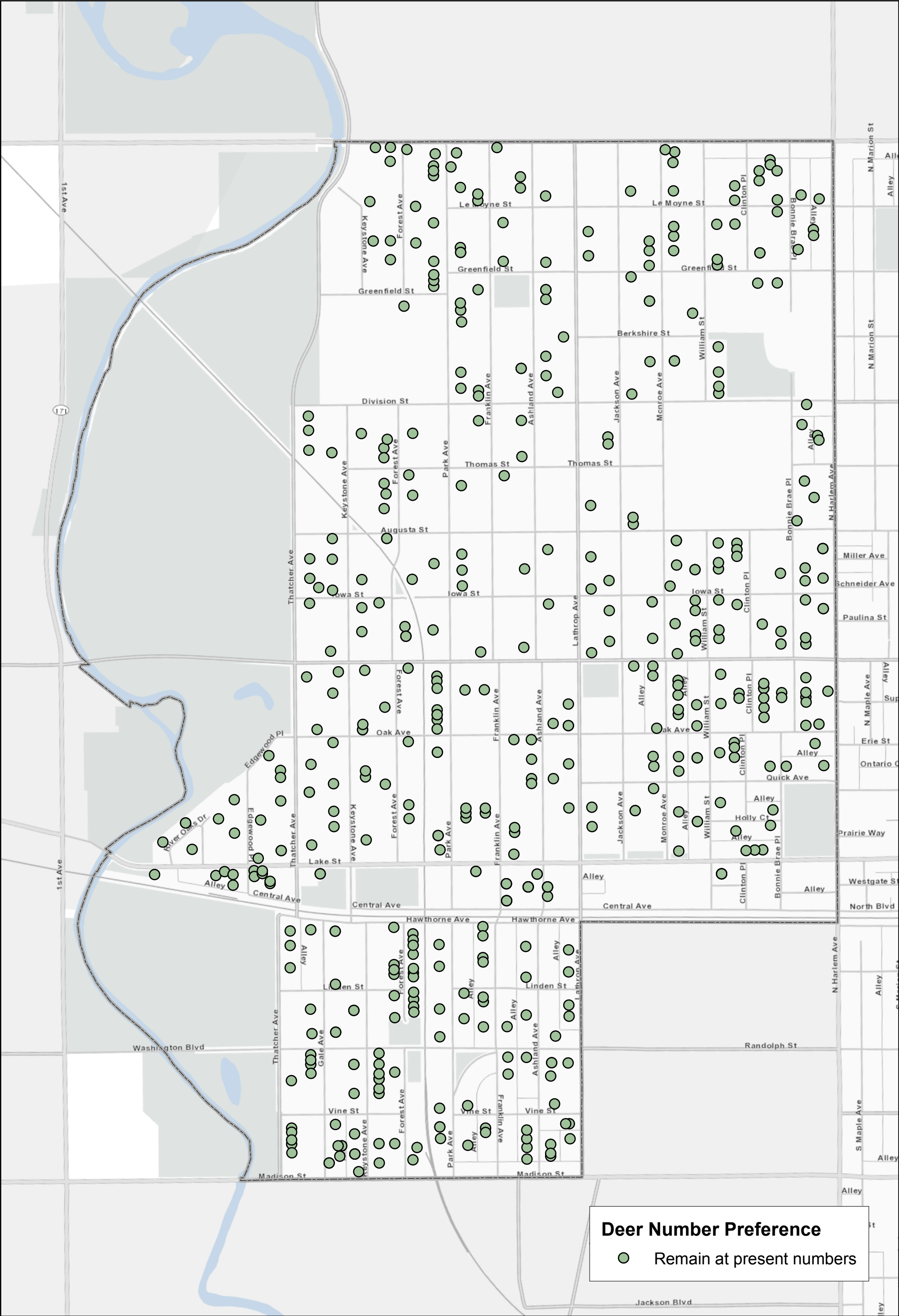


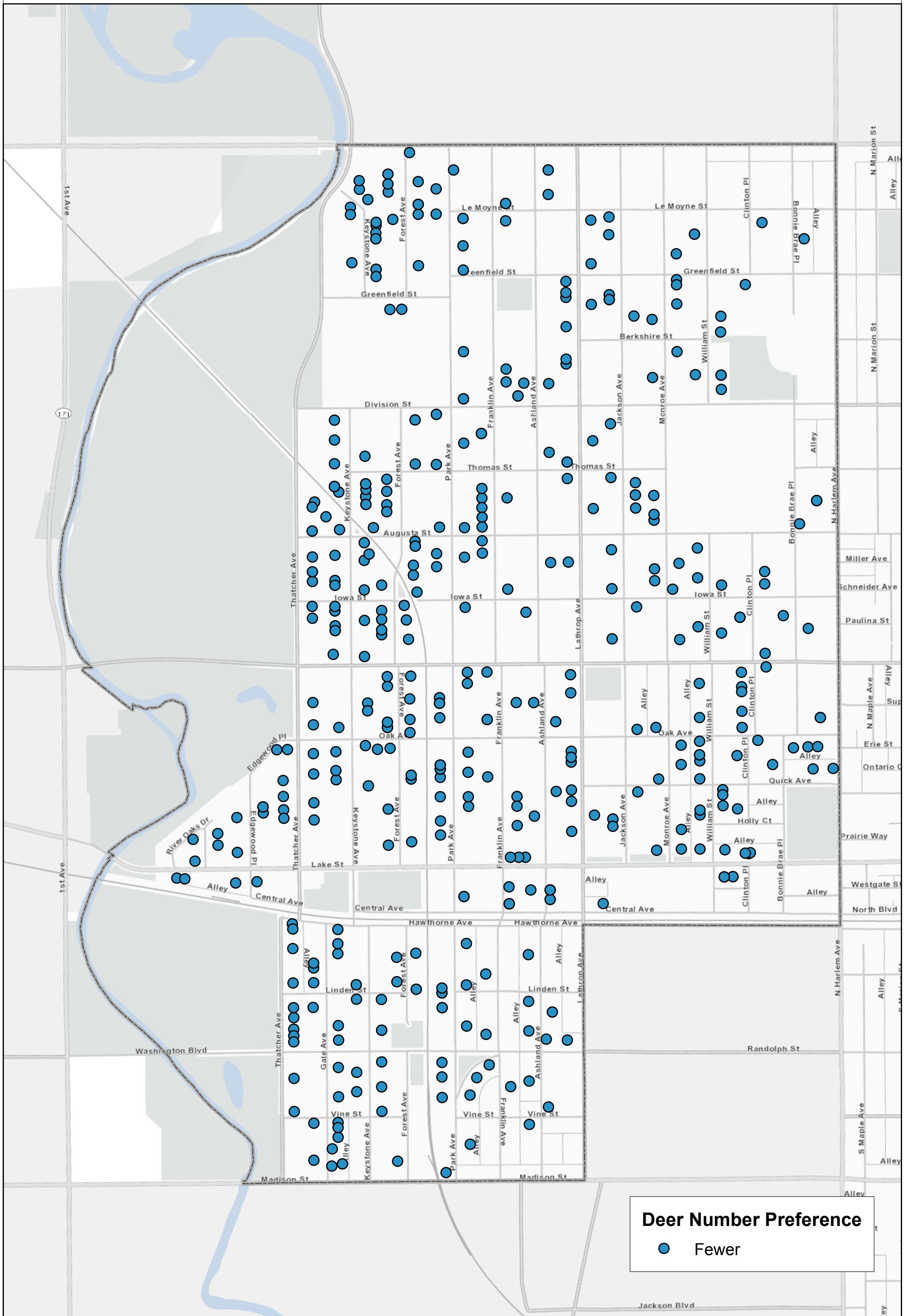
Deer Survey Responses: Question 14

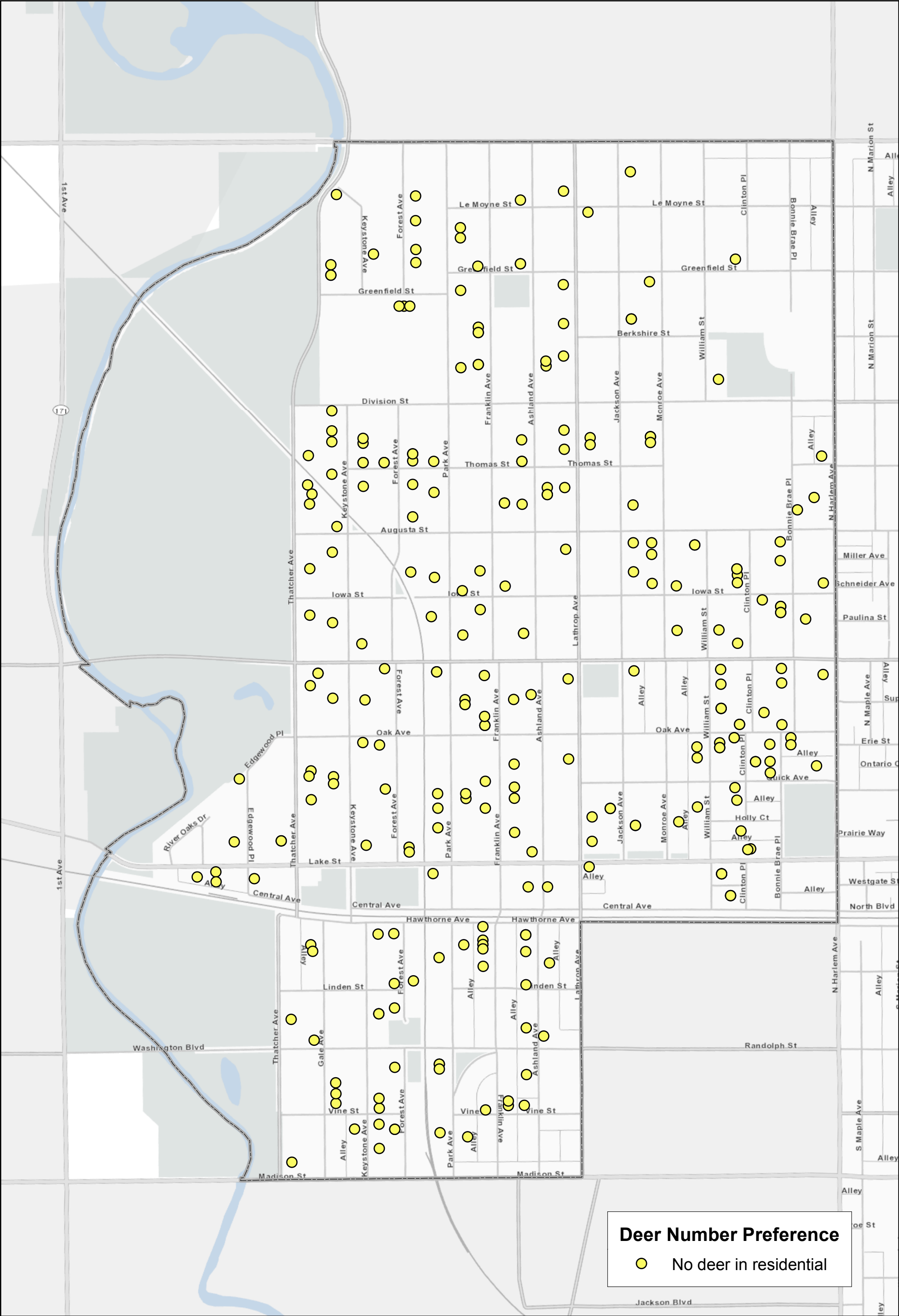

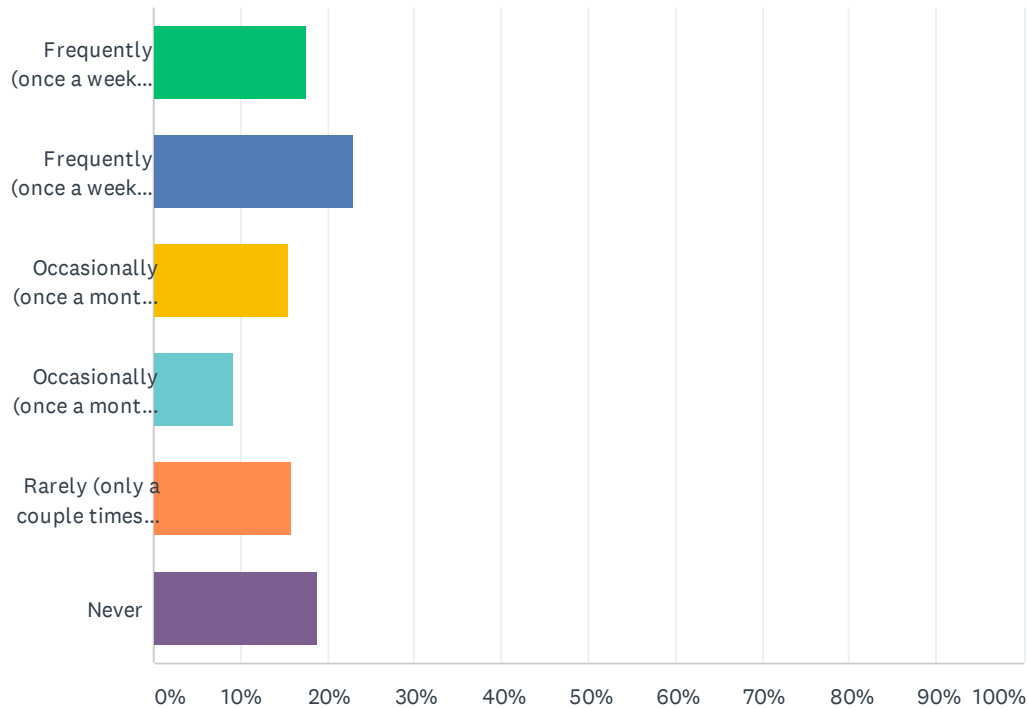

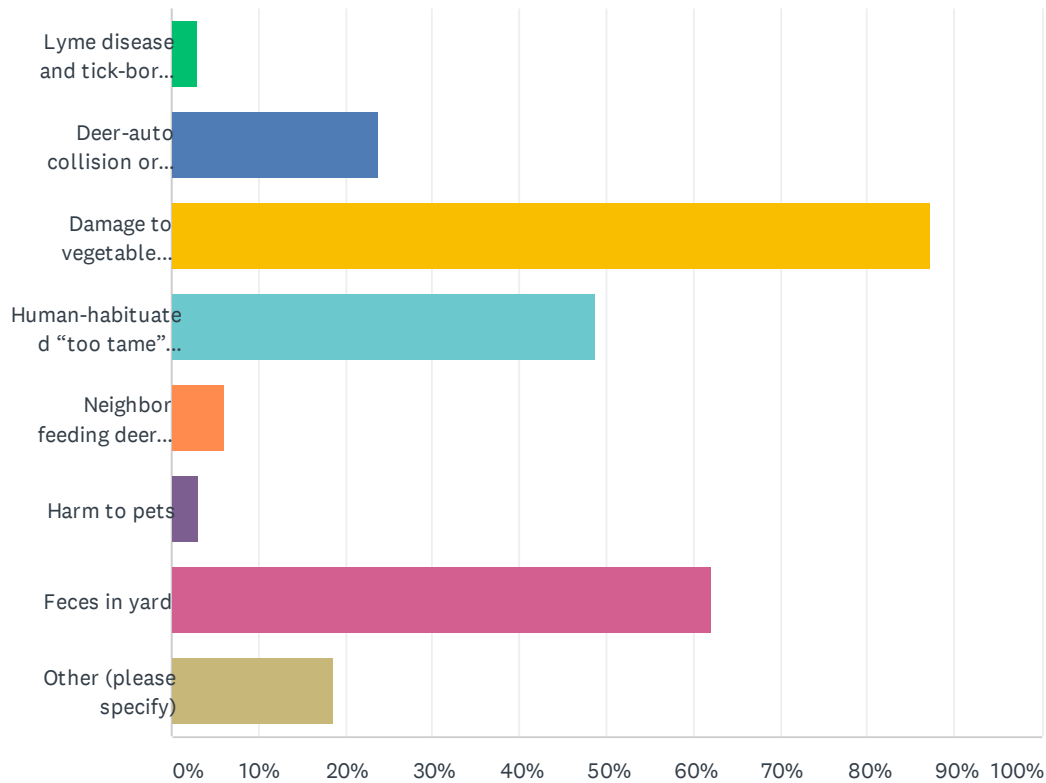

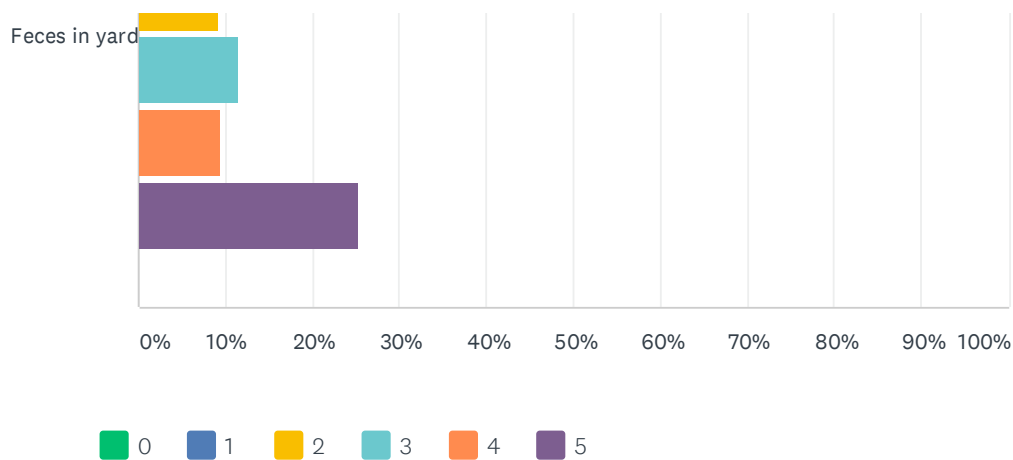

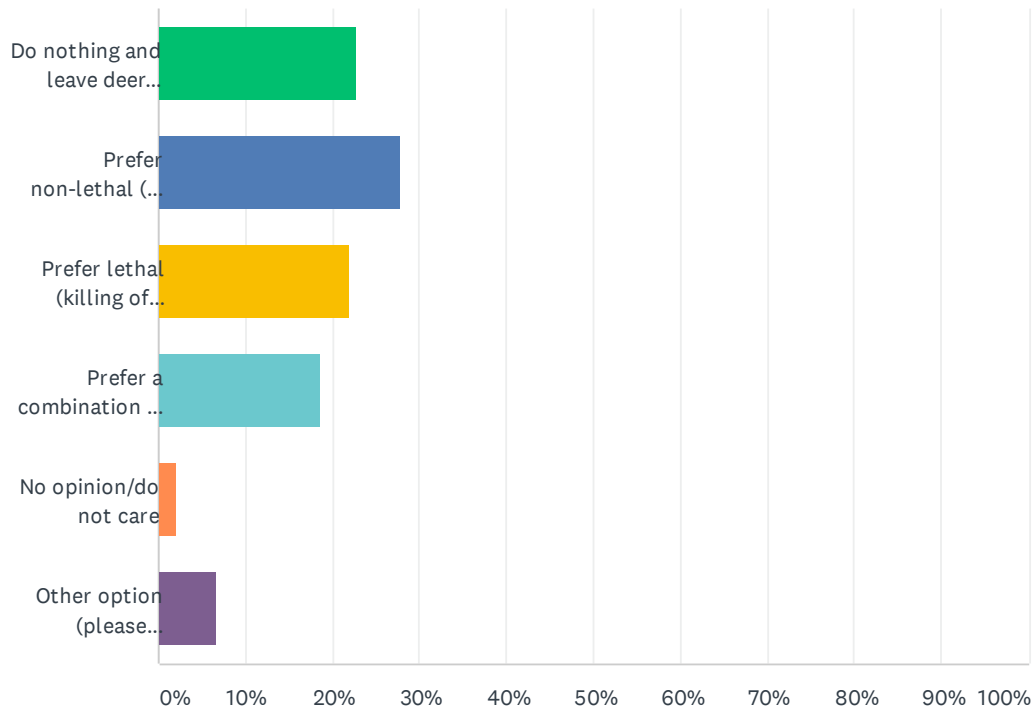
