- Benefits of Bike Patrol



Illinois Bike Safety Laws

- Cyclists must obey same “Rules of the Road” as motor vehicles.
- This includes proper lane usage and obeying traffic signals.
- Must stop at stop signs if in the roadway.
- Must stay to the right.
- No more than 2 riders abreast.
- At least one hand must be on handlebars.
- When riding at night, bikes must have white light on front and red reflector on rear.

River Forest Bike Safety Laws

- All children under age 16 must wear a properly fitting bicycle helmet.
- No restriction on sidewalk riding– it is recommended that children ride on sidewalk and adults ride in street.
- Sidewalk cyclists are considered “pedestrians” under state law, but must yield to pedestrians.
- Parked bikes may not obstruct a public way.

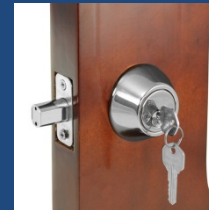

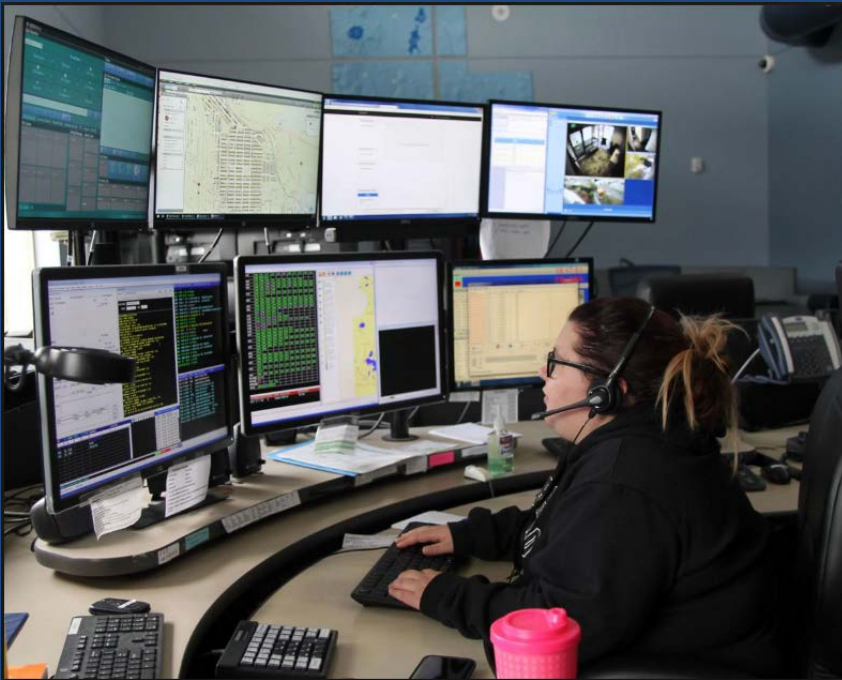


ComEd Fraud

What?

- Any instance where you need the services of:
 - POLICE
 - FIRE
 - Emergency Medical Services (EMS)



Reasoning For Not Reporting Suspected Criminal Activity

- It's none of my business.
- Someone else will report it.
- The Police are too busy.
- That noise was probably nothing.
- You may be the next victim.
- What if they don't?
- Calls of in-progress crimes or suspicious activity are always a high priority.
- Why did it attract your attention?

When?

- If you see suspicious activity...call!
- Don't rely on someone else to act.
- Don't waste precious time consulting with someone else first.

CALL US OUT!



How?



- DIAL **911** for emergencies.



- Dial **708.366.7125**
For non-emergencies.

What to Say

1. Describe why you are calling.
2. Name, address, and phone number.
3. Give detailed suspect/vehicle description.
4. Last known location/direction of travel.
5. Stay calm, remain on the phone to give additional information.

2019 Illinois Traffic Stop Study

- Data
 - Illinois Traffic Stop Forms
 - Information about the driver (including race) and the officer
 - The location of the stop
 - Reason for the stop
 - Outcome of the stop
 - Search activity and search findings of contraband.

2019 Illinois Traffic Stop Study

- Rate-Number of Individuals stopped divided by benchmark
- Ratio-Minority Rate of stops compared to White Rate of stops
- Benchmarks-Data from
 - American Community Survey (2014-2018)
 - 2010 US Census
 - Illinois Secretary of State

2019 Illinois Traffic Stop Study

- River Forest PD Benchmark
 - Comprised of cities within the Fourth District of Cook County
 - Comparing previous years studies to 2019 Study is difficult
 - Previous studies from 2004-2018 used Estimated Minority Driving Population
 - 2019 Study uses ACS 5 year estimates when previous studies used US Census Data

2019 Illinois Traffic Stop Study

- Benchmark Limitations
 - People from outside the benchmark area travel through jurisdiction
 - Different groups use and travel the roads at varying rates of time, seasonal variations
 - Recommendation from study:
 - Observational Studies to create a more accurate Benchmark

2019 Illinois Traffic Stop Study

- Estimated Minority Driving Population
 - Used in 2004-2018 Studies.
 - River Forest EMDP-59.6%
 - Comparison of 2019 Data with 2018 EMDP
 - Ratio of White Drivers Compared to Minority Drivers:
 - 1:1.01

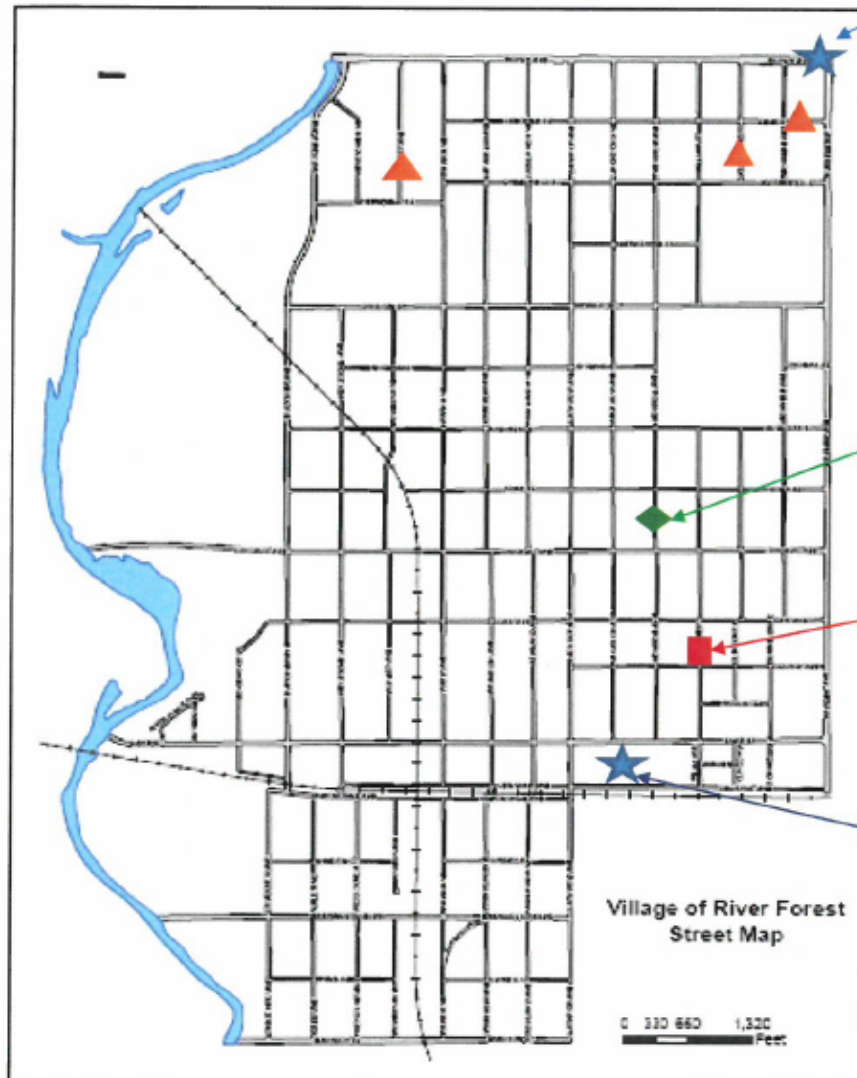
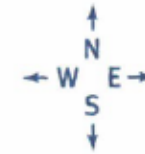
