The RFCC is comprised of two groups:



Tripcom MRC (Triple Community Medical Reserve Corps)

The TRIPCOM MRC is made up of medical and non-medical volunteers from River Forest, Forest Park & Elmwood Park whose primary responsibility is to respond to a public health emergency or any other emergency event that would put our citizens at risk.



Community Emergency Response Team

The CERT's goal is to educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.



TRIPCOM MRC

- First Aid Services & Training
- POD (Point of Dispensing)
 - In the event of a widespread pandemic, the POD is the mechanism by which medicines will be distributed to the public on a widespread scale









What you can do you can do to help:

FEMA In Our Neighborhood

The purpose of the FEMA in Our Neighborhood Program is to leverage FEMA employees to help promote preparedness actions in their local communities.

Cybersecurity – Learn how to prevent, detect and respond to cyber incidents.

Pandemic - Know the facts about a pandemic.

Flooding – If you approach a flooded road: turn around, don't drown.

Build a Kit – Make sure your emergency kit has the right items.






FEMA In Our Neighborhood - Make A Plan

Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes, so it's important to know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if separated.

- STEP 1: Put a plan together by asking questions such as:
 - How will I receive emergency alerts and warnings?
 - What is my shelter plan?
 - What is my evacuation route?
 - What is my family/household communication plan?
- STEP 2: Consider specific needs in your household.
 - Different ages?
 - Dietary needs?
 - Medical needs?
 - Cultural and religious considerations?

- STEP 3: Fill out a Family Emergency Plan:
 - Download and fill out a family emergency plan or use it as a guide to create your own.


