### Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to February.

In January, the Village Board of Trustees and I voted to form a Deer Management Ad Hoc Committee to investigate and provide a written report and recommendations regarding deer management in the Village. Tuesday, February 18th, 2020. Recommendations for appointments to the Committee will be made at the Village Board meeting on Monday, February 24th.

At the January 27th Committee of the Whole meeting, Village Staff presented a draft Capital Improvement Plan for Fiscal Years 2021-2025. Click <u>here</u> to view the draft document. The Capital Improvement Plan or CIP identifies major capital projects and corresponding funding sources for projects that are \$10,000 or more. This is the first step in our annual budget process and an important step in ensuring that the Village's facilities, equipment, fleet and infrastructure continue to be well maintained.

The Village Board of Trustees and I were proud to welcome our newest Firefighter/Paramedic, Jonathan Rouse, to River Forest. We are always appreciative of the individuals that work to keep our community safe.

### Village Spotlight

In 2016 the Public Works Department purchased equipment to manufacture salt brine in-house and began using it to pre-treat roadways before snow and ice events. This method is known as anti-icing. The alternative, which is called deicing, is to let the snow bond/freeze to the road, then apply rock salt to break the bond between the snow and the pavement.



Salt brine is a solution of salt and water. It has a freezing

point lower than pure water and, as such, is a useful tool in reducing the adhesion of snow and ice to road surfaces. Studies have shown that anti-icing will achieve the same level of service on a road or highway using between one-quarter and one-fifth the amount of salt used in deicing.

This winter, crews have applied 6,000 gallons of salt brine to Village roads, parking lots and alleys.

#### Affordable Housing Plan

The Plan Commission began discussions regarding the creation of an Affordable Housing Plan in <u>October</u>, 2019. In <u>January</u> the Commission reviewed an initial draft of the Plan and accepted public comment. The Commission will review a revised draft on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>3/3</u>, <u>7PM</u> before making a recommendation to the Village Board that the plan be adopted. The revised draft Plan will be available online no later than Friday, February 28, 2020.

#### Snow Removal - Know the Code

Residents are asked to review the below Village code items related to snow removal, as well as aid the Fire Department by making sure that <u>hydrants are accessible</u> in case of an emergency.

 Village code requires residents and business owners to remove snow and ice from sidewalks in front of and adjacent to their property within 24 hours after an event. If you are on a corner lot, you are responsible for removing snow on all sidewalks adjacent to your property.

 Snow or ice frozen on sidewalks that cannot be removed without injury to the pavement should be treated with an abrasive material until weather permits further clean-up.

 Parking on Village streets is prohibited after snow exceeds two inches in depth, and for an eight hour period following the cessation of the snowfall.

 Snow removal contractors are prohibited from using snow blowers between the hours of 1AM and 5AM.

 The placement of snow or ice on any Village owned street, alley or sidewalk is prohibited.

The Township Assessor is hosting an outreach seminar with the Cook County Assessor on how to appeal your property's assessment and you will be able to appeal and ask questions directly to the staff from the Cook County Assessor Office. First installment tax bills should arrive by the first week of February and are due **Tuesday**, **3/3**. Tax bills can be paid <u>online with the Cook County</u> <u>Treasurer</u>. River Forest is set to close its appeal period **3/9**. Appeals may be filed <u>online</u> <u>with the Cook County Assessor</u>.
