Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to February.

I hope you all have fared well during what has been our area's coldest snap in years.

Starting in January and continuing into February, the Board of Trustees and I will be discussing the budget for the upcoming fiscal year starting May 1st. At our last meeting on January 28th, we began this

process by looking at the Capital Improvement Plan, which identifies major capital projects and a corresponding funding source for projects that are \$10,000 or more. The next task will be looking at our overall budget, which accounts for all revenue and expenses used to fund traditional services like police, fire, public works and administration.

An important source of revenue - but not our only source - is property taxes. One topic I continually receive feedback on is the River Forest property tax bill. By now, you should have received the first installment of your property tax bill for 2018. If you have questions regarding your 2018 tax bill, I suggest you contact our River Forest Township Assessor, Pam Kende at 708-366-2787 and she will assist you.

While no one enjoys cutting the check to the Cook County Treasurer's office, it is important to understand what the Village does to ensure that our community remains a desirable place for people to live while not taxing you out of River Forest.

All of our programs and services are provided with these guiding principles in mind:

- Providing a safe community.
- Making decisions that protect our property values.
- Working to stabilize property taxes.

These guiding principles are why the Village must focus on economic development in order to strengthen the tax base.

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Approximately half of the property in River Forest is non-taxable, and River Forest is landlocked with very few opportunities to create new development. We must do what we can to get the highest and best use out of each property while maintaining our small-town charm.

In order to create opportunities, we have approved tax increment financing districts for the Madison Street and North Avenue corridors. Projects such as the mixed use development at Lake & Lathrop and the senior living facility at Chicago & Harlem help strengthen our tax base and stabilize our property tax bill – and bring amenities to the village.

Our continued commitment to our guiding principles and core values, in conjunction with using sound economic development strategies, will enable the Village to create more assessed valuation. This will benefit the entire community for the long term.

Compared to our neighbors, River Forest has a low overall tax rate, demonstrating our strong value to our residents. For instance, in 2017, a home assessed at \$500,000 in River Forest will have an overall tax bill that will be approximately 15 percent **lower** than a comparable home assessed at \$500,000 in Forest Park.

2017 Property Tax Rates (Payable in 2018)

River Forest's lower property tax rate is complemented by all of our wonderful community assets such as strong public safety, walkable neighborhoods, award-winning schools, beautiful parks, a historic public library, and many convenient transportation options. These strengths, coupled with a lower property tax rate, are what creates great value for the residents of River Forest.

Information other than property taxes:

I am excited to promote the River Forest Community Calendar, now live at <u>RFHappenings.com</u>. This online calendar is the work of the River Forest Collaboration Committee: representatives from the Village, District 90, District 200, River Forest Township, River Forest Public Library and River Forest Park District. The calendar is a great example of how working together makes for a stronger, better informed community. I shared this <u>initiative</u> with mayors from around the country during the recent <u>Mayors Innovation</u> <u>Project</u> in Washington D.C. and this initiative was well received. Thanks to all of you who made this happen.

River Forest has joined the Dementia Friendly America network of communities. After holding a Dementia Friendly River Forest kickoff meeting in 2018, the Village of River Forest and the Township, along with Loyola University Health System, were designated the champion organizations to coordinate the group's continued work. Dementia Friendly River Forest will partner with the library, plus home care and social services to help develop initiatives, which will be rolled out in the coming months. The Center for Gerontology at Concordia University Chicago will track their progress and share their findings with the community. The group is looking at innovative ways to reduce stigma, support persons living with dementia, and provide aid to their families. Dementia Friendly River Forest will be exploring the development of the "River Forest Care Corps" in order to provide opportunities for volunteers to offer respite care. This will be important work in which I hope you will all be engaged.

Later this month, I will be delivering a State of the Village report to the Board of Trustees.

Community Crime Prevention Meeting

Carjackings

Our neighboring communities have had an uptick in carjackings recently. Though there is no way to predict who will be victimized, taking preventative measures will help protect you and your property. Remember to keep your doors locked, be aware of your surroundings, and notify the River Forest Police of anything suspicious. Distractions inside the vehicle can hamper your ability to see dangers outside. In the event of a carjacking remember this: Your car can be replaced, YOU CAN'T! Don't Get Left Out in the Cold

With winter in full effect, motorists are more likely to leave running vehicles unattended. The River Forest Police Department

knows this, and so do car thieves. Unattended vehicles with keys in the ignition are prime targets for roaming thieves looking for a good opportunity. Additionally, many proximity key fob vehicles with push-start ignitions can be driven away without the key fob in the vehicle. Whether you're warming up your car in the morning or running into the gas station for a pack of gum, make sure your vehicle is secured properly and cannot be driven off without you, even if that means turning off the car. Recent studies show modern cars do not need to "warm up" and it can cause more harm than good. So, as nice as it is to return to a warm car, if leave your car running and unattended, you may return to find yourself left out in the cold.

Special Message from the River Forest Township Assessor

By now you should have received your first installment property tax bill. If you haven't received your tax bill, the Township Assessor can help you receive a duplicate tax bill. This bill is 55% of the total amount of taxes you paid in the previous year. All exemptions and changes to your 2018 assessment will be taken into account on your second installment tax bill that usually comes out in July.

The River Forest Township Assessor is assisting seniors with their Senior Exemptions. All seniors must file for their Senior Exemptions every year. They have extended the deadline for filing your exemption. If you would like help completing your forms please call the Township Assessor at 708-366-2787 for an appointment during the week or our walk-in hours are Thursday from 10 AM – 12 PM. For new homeowners, we are able to assist you with the homeowner exemption paperwork.

River Forest is in the last year of a tri-annual assessment period. River Forest Township will be open for appeals with the Cook County Assessor starting on Wednesday, February 6 for 30 days. Appeals are filed on-line at the Cook County Assessor's website: <u>www.cookcountyassessor.com</u>. We can assist you in finding comparable properties. Please leave your name, address, phone number twice, please speak slowly and clearly. We will create an appeal packet for you.
