Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

As we head into the Independence Day weekend, we all need to remember some important health and safety precautions. Under Phase 4 of Governor Pritzker's reopening plan, Restore Illinois, gatherings of up to 50 people are allowed. Please wear face coverings, practice social distancing, wash your hands and stay home if you are sick or at high risk. Please do not use or allow others to use fireworks. River Forest ordinances and State laws prohibit anyone from using, selling, delivering, exploding or possessing fireworks in the village all year round.

The term "fireworks" includes firecrackers, cherry bombs, M-80's, bottle rockets and Roman candles.

Please keep yourself, your family, and your neighbors safe this holiday weekend. And never drive under the influence.

Temperatures are expected to be warm through the weekend and throughout the coming week. Please remember to:

- Drink plenty of fluids
- Try to stay in the shade or indoors as much as possible
- Check on elderly neighbors and others who may need help
- Take pets indoors and make sure they have plenty of water
- Never leave children or pets unattended in a vehicle

If you have a few minutes this weekend, take a look at a questionnaire from the Deer Management Committee. Since its inception this spring, the Committee has been hard at work on this survey, which will gauge residents' views on the deer population and how it affects the community. The questionnaire will be unavailable during this time, we apologize for any inconvenience.*

We encourage you to watch our upcoming Policing and Social Justice public forum on July 8, 2020 at 6:00 PM. The agenda will mirror the first we held on <u>June 24</u>. This forum will be <u>live streamed</u>.

Village Spotlight - Street Improvment Program



Each year, as part of the Village's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) the Village plans and completes the annual Street Improvement Program. This year's projects are anticipated to start later this month and are budgeted at \$825,000 funded by Motor Fuel Tax funds, Water/Sewer funds, and an Infrastructure Improvement Bond fund. In 2018, the Village hired Roadbotics to analyze Village street conditions and establish a rating. These ratings are then categorized into conditions of Excellent, Good, Fair, and Poor. The purpose of this program is to improve the condition of local streets by bringing streets with condition ratings of Fair or Poor to Good or Excellent.

Streets rated Poor or Fair are prioritized for one of the construction options (rehabilitation, resurfacing, or reconstruction) depending on the condition, location, and estimated traffic volumes. The timing in improving streets is critical. Waiting too long to address street repairs will result in further deterioration, at which time a more costly repair becomes necessary. Overnight Parking Ban Lifted

Overnight parking will be allowed on Village streets for the Independence Day weekend from 12:01AM Friday, 7/3, 2020 through 9:00AM Monday, 7/6, 2020. No overnight parking waivers will be required during this period. All other parking regulations remain in effect.

2020-2021 Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers for 2020-2021 are now available for purchase. Due to the unprecedented circumstances presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, the deadline for purchasing the vehicle stickers has been delayed by 60 days. The stated deadline of 7/14 on the application has been extended to 9/14/20. In order to avoid late fees and citations, vehicle stickers must be purchased and affixed to your windshield by 9/14/20. All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- Online at the Village Website by clicking here.
- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be downloaded here).
- Drop off your application in the green drop box in front of Village Hall or in person during regular business hours.

If you choose any one of the no-contact payment options, the vehicle sticker will be delivered to you via US Mail.

Stickers are \$45 for passenger vehicles and \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens (one senior citizen vehicle sticker per household). Vehicle sticker applications were recently mailed. If you receive an application for a vehicle that you no longer own or a duplicate application, please notify the Village by either calling, or returning the application noting the vehicle's status in the enclosed envelope, so that the vehicle will be removed from our records.

Protect Your Bike

The Police Department offers these tips on how to protect bicycles:

- Cable locks should not be used as a primary means of locking a bike. Cheaper and older locks can often be broken without any tools. Use a quality U-Lock.
- Aim to have the hardest bike to steal on the rack. Consider two U-locks, or a U-lock and one heavy-duty cable.
- Do not rely on foot traffic to keep your bike safe; years of reports have taught us that many thefts, particularly those involving cutting cable locks, occur under the cover of crowd activity or in front of bustling cafés or restaurants.
- Tug on whatever you are about to lock onto in order to make sure it cannot be easily removed.
- Bicycles are often stolen from garages and store rooms. Lock your bike securely to an immovable object even if it is in a "secure" place.
- Do not leave your bike unlocked in a back yard, park, alley, or outside a business.
- Register your bicycle online by clicking here.

Consumption of Alcohol

The Police Department would like to remind residents that **underage consumption of alcohol** (under the age of 21) is prohibited statewide and re-enforced by Village Local Ordinance (Village Code 8-5-34). Parents or guardians facilitating underage consumption will be held accountable under the **Social Hosting Ordinance** (Village Code 8-11-3). The Department will also begin its Fourth of July safety campaign to encourage safe and sober driving. Please click <u>here</u> for the full release and follow these tips for a safe holiday:

- Designate a sober driver and give them your keys before you go out.
- Don't let friends or family members drive under the influence.
- If you are drunk or impaired by marijuana or other drugs, call a taxi, take mass transit, use your favorite ridesharing service, or call a sober friend or family member to get you home safely.
- Promptly report drunk drivers to law enforcement by pulling over and dialing 911.
- Make sure everyone in your vehicle wears their seat belt. It's not only the law, but also your best defense against an impaired driver.

GREEN NEWS

Parkways for Pollinators Garden Planting Season Is Almost Here!



The Sustainability Commission encourages residents to plant natives for their deep root structure to support healthy soils while mitigating flooding with the added benefit of supporting pollinators. The Commission created the <u>Parkways for Pollinators</u> initiative three years ago in partnership with the <u>Deep Roots Project</u>, a local nonprofit with expertise in organic gardening, to assist and educate residents on the benefits of native plants and the importance of pollinators. Beginning this summer, the Parkways for Pollinator gardens will be offered to both private residents and local institutions independently of Green Block Parties via an online application available on the Village of River Forest website. Green Electric Aggregation Program

Beginning in September 2020, the Village of River Forest will establish a green electric aggregation program that supports renewable energy projects and offsets the Village's CO2 emissions, making significant progress towards the goal of to reaching 100% renewable energy by 2050. The electric aggregation program is estimated to eliminate nearly 26,000 metric tons of CO2 per year, equivalent to the annual emissions of approximately 5,500 cars. It would take 34,000 acres of forest



(137 times the size of Thatcher Woods) to sequester the same amount of carbon. Click <u>here</u> to learn more about the program. Residents and businesses will receive a letter from the Village with additional information this month.

Free and Reduced Priced Lunches

District 90 will continue to offer student lunches at no cost to help support our families who may be unexpectedly facing times of food insecurity due to circumstances such as unemployment or a reduction of work hours. Every Monday through 7/31, the District will deliver a week's worth of student lunches to help any D90 family indicating need. The packages include both perishable and non-perishable food items. This support of our families is in collaboration with OPRF High School and the District's transportation vendor.
