

The Village of River Forest is a beautiful suburban Village adjacent to Chicago in Cook County and is nestled amongst beautiful tree lined streets. River Forest is home to two universities, Dominican University and Concordia University Chicago. Police Department Overview

The Police Department is staffed with 28 sworn Police Officers including the Chief, one Deputy Chief, a Commander, five Sergeants and twenty Police Officers.

The Police Department also employs a Community Service Officer and Records Clerk to handle non-patrol service functions and administrative functions.

The Department is a member of the Northern Illinois Police Alarm System (NIPAS), the Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System (ILEAS), the West Suburban Directed Gang Enforcement Task Force (WEDGE), and the West Suburban Major Crimes Task Force (WESTAF) through intergovernmental agreements with local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

Police services include uniformed patrol operations, investigations, youth services, senior services, traffic accident investigation and enforcement, bicycle patrol and supplementary services which include disaster preparedness and response, vacation watch program, participation with community action groups, crime prevention, home security assessments, drug abuse intervention, traffic pattern analysis and recommendations, elementary school anti-drug abuse "Too Good For Drugs" program, and Village licensing investigation and enforcement.





Police Department Overview

The River Forest Police Department also has a variety of specialized positions aside from patrol to address different needs within the department and to better serve the public.

Officer Ben Ransom is our Crime Prevention/Senior Services/School Resource Officer who handles a variety of assignments which include ISEARCH, Too Good For Drugs, Junior Citizens Police Academy and quarterly crime prevention meetings. Office Ransom also teaches traffic and bicycle safety at various assemblies through out the year at all River Forest schools.

Officer Dan Humphreys is our Traffic officer and handles a variety of different tasks including, **directed patrols, traffic missions, accident reports and accident investigations.** Officer Humphreys also conducts various proactive and aggressive traffic enforcement throughout the year.





POLICY

- 4.1. It is the policy of this Department to comply with, as well as to strictly enforce the Seat Safety Belt and Child Passenger Protection Acts of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 4.2. Officers are strongly encouraged to initiate and take appropriate enforcement actions upon any vehicle in which the occupants are not in compliance with the Seat Safety Belt and Child Protection Acts of the Illinois Vehicle Code.
- 4.3. Department members operating or riding in a Department vehicle will use the seat safety belts installed by the vehicle manufacturer, properly adjusted and securely fastened. Lap belts will be properly secured in those vehicles equipped with automatic safety belt systems that require the lap portion to be manually secured.

3. POLICY

3.1. It is the policy of this Department to enforce traffic laws at a level sufficient to ensure the safe and expeditious movement of traffic. Violations will be controlled through preventive measures and pro-active enforcement.

3.2.2. police officers should issue citations for hazardous violations such as failing to obey stop signs and traffic control signals, excessive speeding, violations causing traffic crashes; and equipment violations which create a safety hazard, such as driving without headlights after dark. Citations will be issued for traffic law violations which are misdemeanors or felonies.

This General Order details and outlines our agencies polices and procedures regarding DUI enforcement

2. POLICY

- 2.1. This Department supports comprehensive driving under the influence (DUI) enforcement programs and establishes DUI enforcement as one of its highest priorities.
- 2.2. All uniformed police officers assigned to field duties will be trained in DUI detection and enforcement.
- 2.3. Police officers will be alert for signs of alcohol or drug impairment in all contacts with motorists, and make every effort to detect and apprehend them. After conducting an initial examination at the scene of the traffic stop and determining that probable cause for an arrest exists, a police officer will affect an arrest unless unusual circumstances warrant an alternate course of action. Under no circumstances will an officer knowingly allow a motorist under the influence of alcohol or drugs to drive.

The River Forest Police Department is committed to continued training and education for all officers. Throughout the year officers attend in-house training and roll call training for traffic safety related education to keep officers up-to-date with new IVC laws. Officers also get their training through North East Multi-Regional Training (NEMRT) as well as through Suburban Law Enforcement Academy (SLEA). Each month officers must complete online training through Police Law Institute where a variety of topics are addressed including DUI and traffic enforcement matters.


A screenshot showing completed training on Police Law Institute's web-based training portal

Online Training

Annually, each officer receives an electronic copy of law updates from the Illinois Secretary of State. Officers either print out the law updates or save them to their MDT for field use. This year the law update included the change in age for rear-facing child restraint. Any child under the age of 2 years is required to be in a rear facing child restraint.



Synopsis:

Amends the Child Passenger Protection Act. Provides that when any person is transporting a child in this State who is under the age of 2 years in a motor vehicle of the first division or motor vehicle of the second division weighing 9,000 pounds or less, he or she shall be responsible for properly securing the child in a rear-facing child restraint system, unless the child weighs 40 or more pounds or is 40 or more inches tall.

Occupant Protection Training

The River Forest Police Department has (6) six certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians who are trained with the proper installation of a child safety seat. These officers all received their training in 2017 and continue to use their certification throughout the year to assist drivers in ensuring that their child safety seat is properly installed and that the child is properly secured in the seat. Each technician ensures that the driver is fully capable of installing the safety seat properly and on their own.

River Forest Police Department Child Safety Seat Inspection Program

Did you know?

- Illinois state law requires that children under the age of 8 be secured in an appropriate child safety seat, whether that be a car seat or booster seat.
- Children under age 8 but weighing more than 40 pounds may ride in the back seat with a lap belt only if there are not lap/shoulder belts available in the vehicle to be used with a booster seat.
- Illinois law also requires children ages 8 to 16 be buckled in a seat belt or appropriate child car seat.
- Effective Jan. 1, 2019, Illinois law will require children under age 2 to be properly secured in a rearfacing child restraint system unless they weigh more than 40 pounds or are more than 40 inches tall. Children must remain rear-facing until age 2.

Child Safety Seat Questions:

- Is your child safety seat safe?
- Has it been installed in your car properly?
- Is it defective?
- Has it been recalled by the manufacturer?

We are here to help:

Police Officers from the River Forest Police Department, who are trained Child Safety Seat Technicians, will assist you with the proper installation of your child safety seat.

The Technicians will look for improperly installed, broken or recalled safety seats, and will inspect your child safety seat FREE of charge.

To schedule a check of your child safety seat or if you have any questions regarding child safety seats, just call (708) 366-7125.

More Helpful Tips

- Select a car seat based on your child's age, height, and weight.
- Keep your child in the car seat for as long as possible, as long as your child fits the seat's height and weight requirements.
- All children under 13 should ride in the back seat.
- Follow your car seat manufacturer's instructions and your vehicle owner's manual.

The Illinois Truck Enforcement Association is an association designed for Police Officers who are specialized in Truck Enforcement and acts as a central resource point for the trucking industry and resources that are needed to practice truck enforcement in the most professional way possible. ITEA offers continued resources and updates to truck enforcement laws and regulations specifically designed to address weight, dimension, safety and equipment related issues and enforcement on second division vehicles operating on Illinois highways.

The River Forest Police Department has a total of **6 certified Truck Enforcement Officers** and are members of ITEA. Each officer has attended Truck Enforcement I and II which are both 40 hour certification courses through North East Multi-Regional Training (NEMERT). The River Forest Police Department utilizes (4) portable truck scales during their all year round overweight truck enforcement and actively pursue overweight, over dimension, and unsafe trucks from the public highways. Each year at the beginning of July our Certified Truck Enforcement officers conduct a truck overweight enforcement detail and strictly

Officer Humphreys and Officer Landini attended a 40 Hour NEMERT basic traffic crash investigation course in 2017 and since then Officer Humphreys has joined a new multi jurisdictional Major Crash Unit that formed in 2018 to investigate and reconstruct serious and fatal accidents for surrounding jurisdictions which include, Berwyn, Cicero, Elmwood Park, Melrose Park, Forest Park, Broadview, North Riverside, Riverside, Stone Park, Oak Park, Franklin Park, Westchester, Hillside and Berkeley.

Officer Humphreys is part of an on call team to assist accident reconstructionist with the processing of scenes which include photograph, vehicle inspection, and mapping of the crime scene. Officers Humphreys attended monthly in-service training in 2018 for WESTAF Major Crash Unit (MCU) which covered a variety of training in the use of Bosch Crash Data Retrieval (CDR), TruPulse 200X Total Station, accelerometer VC4000PC. This training allowed investigators the opportunity to utilize that knowledge at traffic crash investigations in River Forest and surrounding suburbs.

Kenig, Lindgren, O'Hara, Aboona, Inc, (KLOA, Inc) was retained by the Village of River Forest and River Forest Public school District 90 to recommend a system of safe walking routes to the six public and parochial primary schools in the Village of River Forest. The study also developed a street map exhibit illustrating the recommended routes to the schools.

As part of this study families who attend the public and private schools in River Forest were asked to fill out a survey addressing their concerns over safe walking routes to schools.

The study had identified several measures that can be implemented by the Village of River Forest to enhance safety at the recommended street crossings along the school walking routes, including traffic control modifications, crosswalk marking installing's and pedestrian crossing signage.


Recommendations

The study made several recommendations to enhance the safety on the routes, including upgraded traffic control and increased visibility of the street crossings. Traffic control upgrades include installing stop signs where no traffic control signs exist or where yield signs exist, reversing the directionality of the two-way stop control, converting oneway or two-way stop control to all-way stop control, and implementing measures to increase the visibility of existing signs. The street crossing improvements include installing high visibility (ladder-style) crosswalks where no crosswalks exist, replacing transverse (parallel-line) crosswalks with more visible ladder-style markings, and installing school or pedestrian crossing signage. Many of these recommendations address comments and concerns expressed by survey respondents.

- 61 intersections throughout River Forest were recommended to replace existing transverse crosswalks with high-visibility crosswalk
- 164 unmarked intersections were recommended to have the installation of new high visibility (ladder-Style) crosswalks


The study also identified three locations where crossing guards could be removed in place of other alternatives to address student safety and two new locations for posting of a crossing guard.










Willard Elementary School





Roosevelt Middle School (North)









River Forest Police Join Forces with Agencies Statewide for 2018 Illinois Speed Awareness Day Campaign

During Illinois Speed Awareness Day this July 25th, the River Forest Police Department is taking a proactive approach to promote safety for motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists through both education and enforcement. In Illinois during 2016, speed was the reason for 34.2% of all fatal crashes. That's 369 deaths for the year, or one life every 23.7 hours. These lives can be easily saved by being aware of our speed and understanding how speeding impacts a crash.

In residential areas, speeding can have the following consequences:

 When a pedestrian is hit by a car at 20 MPH there is a 10% likelihood of being killed, at a speed of 30 MPH the percentage increases to a 50% likelihood of being killed.

- . The higher the speed at impact, the more severe the injuries sustained.
- · 37% of the speed-related crashes result in injuries.
- When speeding there is a greater chance that other road users will misjudge how fast you are traveling.
- Speeding extends the distance required to stop a vehicle in emergency situations.
- Speeding reduces a driver's ability to navigate safely around curves or objects in the roadway.

Let's all do our part by taking a proactive approach to prevent fatalities and reduce injuries on the roadways by being aware of our speed and obeying the speed limit signs ALL the time. Operation Chill is in effect

The River Forest Police Department has again partnered with 7-11 to reward good citizenship by youth in River Forest through the Operation Chill program. Now in its 23rd year, Operation Chill is a program in which police throughout the US are provided with coupons for free Slurpees from 7-11, to be given to youth in the community. RFPD has been a part of the program for over a decade, and primarily uses coupons to reward kids wearing helmets while riding their bicycles in the village. During bike safety assemblies, kids are taught that they should always wear their helmets for safety and to comply with village ordinance, but that they may receive a free Slurpee as an added bonus. At their discretion, RFPD officers may also use the coupons to reward kids for other good deeds.

According to 7-11, Operation Chill has grown to include more than 1,000 local law enforcement agencies in the United States and Canada. Nearly 21 million coupons have been distributed to officers on the beat in cities and towns where 7 Eleven does business. #OperationChill 7-Eleven Slurpee



Road Detour - Union Pacific Railroad









• Accident reporting. If you are involved in an accident on a public way, you may call 911 to report the accident. If there are no injuries and all cars involved are drivable, you may be instructed to drive to the nearest police station in the jurisdiction to complete the report. Remember that if weather conditions contributed to your accident, there is a chance that those same conditions may contribute to additional accidents nearby. If safe to do so, you may move your car out of a dangerous location. If you are unable to move your vehicle, remain inside with your seatbelt on.

• Just don't drive. The best way to be safe during inclement weather is to simply avoid driving if possible. Be aware of weather advisories and alerts and plan ahead in order to ensure you are not on the road.




Bike Helmets

All children under the age of 16 must wear a helmet while riding a bike in River Forest. Per village ordinance 9-4-8, "Every person under the age of sixteen years shall wear a properly fitted and fastened protective helmet that meets the standards promulgated by the American National Standards Institute, the American Society for Testing Materials and/or the Snell Memorial Foundation, Inc., whenever that person is: 1) riding or being carried on any bicycle or any carrier attached to or pulled by a bicycle upon any public street, sidewalk or bicycle path; and 2) riding a motorized scooter or motorized skateboard (neither of which are eligible to be licensed under the Illinois vehicle code) upon any public sidewalk."

During annual assemblies and classes at the elementary and middle schools, students are reminded of the ordinance and also the physical dangers of riding without a helmet. Finally, as an added incentive, students are told that they may be awarded a coupon for a free Slurpee® by an RFPD officer if they are observed wearing a helmet while riding their bike. RFPD has partnered with 7-11 for "Operation Chill" for over 10 years and are pleased to announce that we have again partnered together to provide the free Slurpee® coupons to children wearing their helmets while riding their bikes in 2018.

Railroad Property

Per Illinois State law (625 ILCS 5/18c-7503), it is illegal for anyone to be upon railroad property (which includes the rails, embankments, bridges and access roads) unless using it for a legitimate purpose such as fare-paying passengers waiting on a platform or crossing it at a designated location like sidewalks and

public streets. River Forest has two railways that intersect our town; Union Pacific which runs East-West south of Central Ave, and Canadian National which runs North-South from the 7800 Block of Madison to the 1100 Block of Thatcher. Not only is it unlawful to be upon either of these railways but it is also very dangerous. Due to the sporadic, low-volume of traffic on the Canadian National tracks, some people mistakenly believe that they are "abandoned" or not in use but they are.

Message from the River Forest Police Department

With spring here and summer approaching, there will be an increase of pedestrian and cyclist traffic on our streets and sidewalks. Please keep these tips in mind:

- It's always best to walk on sidewalks or paths and cross at street corners using crosswalks.
- When cycling in the roadway, ride to the RIGHT (with traffic).
- Cyclists in the roadway must obey the same "rules of the road" as motor vehicles, such as signaling turns, obeying traffic control devices, and right of way.
- Avoid wearing dark clothing when cycling, skating or jogging at night. Wear bright clothing, with reflective elements if possible.
- When cycling at night, state law requires bikes have a front light (white, visible at 500 feet) and a red reflector in the rear. River Forest Police Department recommends also using a red light attached to the rear.
- When cycling, always wear a helmet!
- Please notify the River Forest Police Department of any suspicious behavior or circumstances you may see. If you are being followed or harassed, move to a safe location and call 911.

Speed Enforcement

The River Forest Police Department utilizes a variety of different devices to assist with traffic enforcement. Each squad is equipped with a multi-directional moving and stationary radar device. Each officer also has access to (2) Stalker II handheld radar devices for optimal speed enforcement. The department also utilizes and deploys (2) message/speed trailers which are placed in areas throughout the Village where there has been increases in traffic complaints and/or accidents. These speed trailers

have the capability to collect data which is then analyzed by the traffic unit. Based upon the data officers then concentrate their efforts during those days and times where high rates of speed are observed.

Traffic Stops- 2018

The River Forest Police Department Patrol Division and Traffic Unit made a total of 5,809 traffic stops. 270 of the stops resulted in a traffic arrest, 63 resulted in a DUI arrest. Of the 5,809 traffic stops, 3,258 warnings were given while 2,218 of the traffic stops resulted in a citation.



In 2016 officers issued 187 safety seat belt citations









2018 Campaign Totals





Overall Citations

The River Forest Police Department tracks and records overall citations issued for the year and not always into specific categories. The Police Department is looking to track citations issued in the categories of Speed and distracted driving in the future.

Traffic Stops (Last 3 Years)

This data shows there has been a slight decrease in the amount of traffic stops over the past 3 years but the overall number of **warnings** has **decreased** and the amount of **citation**s has **increased in 2018**. The Police Department began taking a more aggressive approach focused on enforcing various IVC violations including speed and seat belt violations which contributed to officers issuing more citations and less warnings.

- 13.7% decrease in warnings issued from 2017 to 2018
- 23% increase in traffic stops resulting in citation(s) being issued from 2017 to 2018
- 3.5% decrease in overall traffic stops from 2017 to 2018





The River Forest Police Department utilizes these traffic crash maps to choose the locations for our IDOT STEP grant enforcement zones.










Traffic Crashes – 2018 Data

Overall accidents were down 4.5% from 2017 to 2018. By analyzing when accidents are occurring and on which day of the week, we adjust enforcement efforts accordingly around the hot spots. Also, by deploying our speed and message trailers to the targeted "Hot Spots" we were able to see the effectiveness they had for that area by reduced speeds.









Truck Overweights

Commercial Motor vehicle enforcement leads to safer roads by educating compliance to Commercial Motor vehicle operations.

- In 2017 our certified truck enforcement officers cited 21 trucks for Commercial Motor vehicle violations and collected \$22,615 in fines.
- In 2018 our officers our certified truck enforcement officers cited 10 Commercial Motor vehicles for being overweight and collected \$8,204 in fines.

Alcohol Compliance Checks

On July 28th The River Forest Police Department initiated an "alcohol compliance mission" within River Forest at (5) establishments that have liquor licenses. The compliance checks were performed at CVS, Fresh Thyme, Whole Foods, Walgreens and Jewel Osco. For each compliance check a person under the age of 21 would enter each establishment and attempt to purchase alcohol under the close observation of a Police Officer who is working in a covert capacity. At all establishments the underage participant was denied the purchase. The mission was successful and had 100% compliance. These compliance checks are crucial to the prevention of drinking and driving.
