Here's What Happened During the Village Board's April Meetings

Trustees adopted the budget for the new fiscal year that begins on May 1. For the eighth consecutive year, the Village's spending plan - totaling \$29.874 million - is balanced, thanks to the diligence of a lot of talented individuals who are committed to preserving the vibrancy of our community while keeping our expenditures in check. The Board of Trustees and I would like to thank Village Administrator Eric Palm, Finance Director Joan Rock, department heads and the Village Board's Finance Committee, chaired by Trustee Carmela Corsini, for their hard work. For more about the budget, click <u>here</u>. To give you a few highlights:

- The Police Department has budgeted nearly \$25,000 in training for continual training of its officers in the areas of crisis intervention, civil rights, cultural competency, use of force, procedural justice, and more.
- The Village will invest over \$2.2 million in the streets, sidewalks and alley improvements to enhance the drivability, walkability, and stormwater drainage in River Forest. The Village devoted additional funds to complete two alley improvement projects this year.

River Forest units of government and the Community Center board have committed themselves to participate in a study that will look at the feasibility of renovating, remodeling or building a new center at its present location or somewhere else in town. A request for proposal for the study will be issued soon, and results are expected back by the end of the year. This is an unprecedented collaboration that will benefit the needs of multiple governmental and community interests. We will keep you apprised of our progress.

Trustees adopted a resolution supporting a lawsuit to fight the opioid epidemic facing our community and the nation. There will be no cost to the Village. <u>Click here to read the resolution</u>.

In "green" news, the Village and its Sustainability Commission have partnered with the River Forest Park District to offer garden plots for rental at the Community Garden, which is located at the corner of Jackson and Berkshire. You can register to rent up to three plots at the River Forest Park District administrative office, Additional Village News Village Board Agendas Emergency Notification Sign-up 411 Thatcher Ave., from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, until May 15. There is still time to submit an application for the 2018 <u>Historic</u> <u>Preservation Awards</u> from homeowners, architects or contractors who have completed qualifying jobs in River Forest since January 1, 2013. The nominated structure need not be in a historic district and may be a residential (single family or multiple unit), commercial, public/institutional or religious structure. Nominations must be received on or before May 25, 2018. Awards will be announced at the Historic Preservation Commission meeting on June 22. To apply, <u>click here</u>.

We hope to see you at the 93rd annual Memorial Day parade on **Monday, May 28**. The event will step off at 9:30 a.m. from Constitution Park, travel south on Ashland Avenue to Lake Street, then west to Keystone Park. A free hotdog lunch will top off the day. Our Grand Marshall will be Robert F. Berg, who served in the U.S. Navy from 1961 to 1969. A lot of hard work goes into planning this grand event, which is sponsored by the Civic Association of River Forest, the River Forest Parks Foundation, the River Forest Park District and the Village. Stay Up-to-Date on Current Events

For at least the next two months, 1st Avenue between Lake Street and Washington Boulevard will remain closed due to construction by the Union Pacific Railroad. During this time, IDOT has rerouted 1st Avenue north and southbound traffic along Roosevelt Road and North Avenue to Harlem Avenue. While the detour routes are intended to direct traffic to other IDOT maintained roads, there will likely be some increase in traffic on our streets during this time. I would like to update you on recent key development activity within River Forest. There are planned development projects proceeding through the Village's application process. Those projects include a commercial and residential mixed use building at the southwest corner of Lake and Lathrop and a senior living building with assisted living and memory care services at the northwest corner of Chicago and Harlem. The complete planned development applications will also be available online at least 15 days before a public hearing is held on these applications.

All Contractors Must Be Licensed

All contractors performing work in the Village must be licensed and bonded, including landscape contractors. To obtain a license a contractor must provide the Village with proof of insurance and a surety bond. The insurance protects property owners in the event that the contractor damages the property or if a worker is injured. The surety bond acts as a guarantee that the contractor will perform work in accordance with Village code and other applicable regulations. River Forest Police Department - Did you know?

Pets and leashes

Walking dogs without a leash is unlawful in River Forest. Per village ordinance 8-3-6, all dogs must be leashed when using any public street, sidewalk, parkway, public area or unenclosed premises within the village." Also, leashes should not "be longer than eight feet in length."

Although any River Forest Park District park is considered a "public area", village ordinance 8-13-7 further reinforces that dogs (and cats) must be leashed while in any River Forest parks. Also, any person who brings dogs or cats into the park system must pick up and remove any and all solid waste. Disposal of any solid waste is prohibited in any park district waste receptacle.

Bike Helmets

All children under the age of 16 must wear a helmet while riding a bike in River Forest. Per village ordinance 9-4-8, "Every person under the age of sixteen years shall wear a properly fitted and fastened protective helmet that meets the standards promulgated by the American National Standards Institute, the American Society for Testing Materials and/or the Snell Memorial Foundation, Inc., whenever that person is: 1) riding or being carried on any bicycle or any carrier attached to or pulled by a bicycle upon any public street, sidewalk or bicycle path; and 2) riding a motorized scooter or motorized skateboard (neither of which are eligible to be licensed under the Illinois vehicle code) upon any public sidewalk."

During annual assemblies and classes at the elementary and middle schools, students are reminded of the ordinance and also the physical dangers of riding without a helmet. Finally, as an added incentive, students are told that they may be awarded a coupon for a free Slurpee® by an RFPD officer if they are observed wearing a helmet while riding their bike. RFPD has partnered with 7-11 for "Operation Chill" for over 10 years and are pleased to announce that we have again partnered together to provide the free Slurpee® coupons to children wearing their helmets while riding their bikes in 2018.

Railroad Property

Per Illinois State law (625 ILCS 5/18c-7503), it is illegal for anyone to be upon railroad property (which includes the rails, embankments, bridges and access roads) unless using it for a legitimate purpose such as fare-paying passengers waiting on a platform or crossing it at a designated location like sidewalks and public streets. River Forest has two railways that intersect our town; Union Pacific which runs East-West south of Central Ave, and Canadian National which runs North-South from the 7800 Block of Madison to the 1100 Block of Thatcher. Not only is it unlawful to be upon either of these railways but it is also very dangerous. Due to the sporadic, low-volume of traffic on the Canadian National tracks, some people mistakenly believe that they are "abandoned" or not in use but they are.

Announcing the "Support4U" Program

A new program is being introduced this month to students at Roosevelt, Brooks and Julian Middle Schools and OPRF High School called "Support4U". Support4U is a mental health-related prevention and support resource for students, by which they can text licensed mental health clinicians for assistance or guidance. While students can initiate a text conversation on any issue, some of the matters that students might wish to address could include anxiety, depression, substance use, suicidal ideation, eating disorders, bullying, abuse, or any other mental health-related topic.
