Here's what happened in August

The Village Board of Trustees and I were honored to swear in Mike

Smith to the position of Fire Lieutenant. Lieutenant Smith has spent 18 of his 21 years of fire service in River Forest. He has received numerous commendations for his outstanding work as a fire investigator and paramedic

Congratulations to the River Forest 12U baseball team for giving the community a summer to remember. For the first time in its 67-year history, the team captured its first 12U State Championship and advanced to the Little League Great Lakes Region Tournament. The Village hosted a watch party for both nationally televised games and held a parade and rally to recognize and

congratulate the team. The Board of Trustees and I also recognized the team during our August 26 meeting. Congratulations to the team - you made us all proud!

Thanks to all of you who came out to Keystone Park on August 24 for the sixth annual Food Truck Rally. This event, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Oak Park, the Village and the River Forest Park District, was a big success. We thank the organizations and all of the volunteers who made it happen.

The Village has issued a permit to start construction on the Chicago and Harlem Senior Care Community. Site demolition has begun and a ground-breaking is anticipated this fall. After hearing a presentation from staff and discussing the matter, the Village Board of Trustees decided to conduct a community meeting to get resident input and gather more information on whether we should allow cannabis business establishments (CBEs) in town. The discussion will center around a new state law, the Illinois Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act (CRTA), which allows adults to possess and consume recreational marijuana, with restrictions. The law also defines and establishes baseline regulations on CBEs and provides a framework for how they can obtain state licenses. Visit the Village's website to learn more, view the staff presentation that will be made on September 9, listen to the August 26 Board discussion, and view a list of FAQs. The meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. on September 9 at the Village Hall.

Here's a preview of September

Following the 6 p.m. meeting and community discussion, if the Board chooses to move forward with permitting CBEs in River Forest, the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) will be directed to conduct a public hearing in October to consider changes to the Zoning Ordinance that would allow for a dispensary and craft growers. At the end of November, Trustees will consider the ZBA's recommendation and make a decision. Other Village Code amendments will be made before the law goes into effect on January 1, 2020. The Village Board would also need to consider an Ordinance imposing a 3% excise tax on cannabis sales in River Forest and would need to take final action on that Ordinance by October 1, 2019.

Also on September 9, at the request of the Park District, the Village Board of Trustees will be asked to approve the proposed turf at Keystone Park as a minor amendment to the Park District's planned development permit. Consistent with Village ordinance and past practice, turf installations that do not cause greater use of the Village's stormwater system are treated as minor amendments.

An update on deer is tentatively scheduled for discussion at the September 23 Village Board of Trustees meeting. Meeting information will be posted on the website and Facebook. Click <u>here</u> for the FAQ on deer maintenance.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Village's annual Fall Leaf Collection Program runs from September 16 through November 29. The next opportunity to dispose of leaves after November 29th will be during the yard waste collection program which starts in April 2020. Rake only leaves onto the street by 7 AM on your collection day, leaving the curb exposed, where Village and Strom crews will collect them. Grass clippings, brush or any other type of yard waste mixed with your leaves will not be collected. Leaves are collected on both sides of the street in accordance with the following schedule:

Mondays: The area west of Thatcher including Edgewood, Auvergne, River Oaks and Lake, and all streets south of the Union Pacific Rail Road tracks.

Tuesdays: Harlem through and including William.

Wednesdays: Monroe through and including Lathrop, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Thursdays: Ashland through and including Park, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.

Fridays: Forest through and including Thatcher, north of the Union Pacific Railroad.
